## **APEC Symposium on Socio-economic Disparity**

## <Background>

One of APEC's core goals is to promote economic prosperity and stability in the Asia-pacific region for the common good of the people by reinforcing the multilateral trading system and eliminating barriers to trade and investment. There is no doubt that trade and investment liberalization greatly contributes to the economic growth and welfare of the people in the APEC region. The positive outcome of the Midterm Stocktake on the progress toward achieving the Bogor Goals also confirmed this.

The rapidly transforming global economic landscape and increased integration, however, have been associated with problems such as widening disparity among sectors and groups in both developed and developing economies. In this regards, we are confronted with the common task of addressing the problems of the socio-economic disparity in APEC economies, so that the benefits of trade and investment liberalization and economic growth can reach all people and further liberalization can be promoted. In response to meet this challenge, APEC Leaders have agreed to conduct a research on socio-economic disparity issues at the Leaders' Meeting in Busan in November 2005.

## <Purpose>

The purpose of "APEC symposium on socio-economic disparity" to be held in Seoul during 28-29 June is to deepen the understanding of socio-economic disparity issues and to share experiences and policy responses among APEC members. The symposium will also be the opportunity to explore model policy examples that help to reduce the socio-economic disparity with a view to ensuring that all people have the opportunity to share the benefits generated by trade liberalization and economic growth. Expanding the circle of beneficiaries of trade liberalization and economic growth will also contribute to further liberalization and sustainable economic growth through fostering a favorable environment for globalization and the enlargement of total demand in an economy.

Representatives from APEC member economies, experts from international organizations such as ADB, OECD and renowned scholars will participate in the symposium to discuss challenges and impediments related to socio-economic disparity issues and share the ideas on policy measures to reduce socio-economic disparity.
