Introduction

In recent years, two very powerful drivers of change have emerged in our economies; shift towards sustainability and explosion of digital technologies. Both require us to rethink the way we view the world around us, the way we conduct businesses, and the way we plan for the future. Yet, there have been surprisingly few attempts to find ways to complement the two forces.

Traditional sectors are taking up digital technologies in all fronts of their businesses and women entrepreneurs around the world have started to participate in the digital economy in the form of e-business, albeit slower than their male counterparts. Taking up sustainability challenge, however, is no easy task even for established businesses and the task becomes more taunting for women due to the socio-economic burden they are traditionally placed under.

Now, in this emerging stage of the digital economy, is the right time to explore the potential digital technologies to bring wider and long lasting benefits to women. In order to discuss how we can channel the dynamism of e-Business for social and economic good of women, APEC Women's e-Biz Center and Asian Pacific Women's Information Network Center (APWINC) of Sookmyung Women's University of Korea in partnership with the Australia Government Office for Women (OfW) are hosting "APEC Forum on the Digital Economy for Women 2007: Building a Sustainable e-Future" in Port Douglas, Australia June 22-23, 2007.

As part of APEC Initiative for Women's Participation in Digital Economy, APWINC has been organizing "APEC Forum on the Digital Economy for Women" since 2005, thanks to the generous support of the Ministry of Commerce, Industry and Energy (MOCIE) of Korea and Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC). APEC Women's e-Biz Center (APEC WeBiz Center) has been established at APWINC, Sookmyung Women's University to carry out the APEC Initiative with the official opening on August 22, 2005.
