# SESSION 3: APEC PROJECTS

#### Survey of Policies and Programs to Measure and Promote Energy Efficiency in Industry in APEC Economies

#### • Objectives:

- Understand the full range of policies and programs for improving energy efficiency in the industrial sector in APEC economies (with particular attention to benchmarking tools).
- Identify successful policies and program approaches.
- Assess the usefulness of available indicators to measure policy/program progress.
- Implementer: Centre for International Economics, Australia
- **Status:** CIE is currently preparing a desktop study of industrial policies in each of the APEC member economies. In the next month they plan to:
  - provide each economy with a summary of the findings for their own economy
  - distribute a survey to each economy, asking them to fill in the gaps, particularly in regard to recent developments in the industrial sector
  - prepare a draft report, and circulate through EGEE&C for comments, by December 2009.

## Comparison of Building Energy Codes in APEC Economies

- Objectives:
  - Construct model framework for building energy code evaluation
  - Gather and analyze data from APEC economies
  - Develop individual reports on economies as well as a comparative analysis that highlights best practices transferable across economies.
- Implementer: Alliance to Save Energy/Building Codes Assistance Project
- Status:
  - Expected completion November 2009
  - Individual economy reports completed for all APEC economies:
    - Updated information from 2003 APERC paper on energy efficiency programs for Chile, China, Hong Kong, Indonesia, Malaysia, Mexico, Peru, Philippines, Russia, Chinese Taipei, Thailand, Viet Nam
    - Utilized 2009 PNNL country reports prepared for APP, for Australia, Canada, Japan, Korea, and the United States
    - Prepared new reports for Brunei, New Zealand, Papua New Guinea, and Singapore
  - APEC Synthesis Report in preparation:
    - Compares the technical stringency of codes and standards and looks at the long-term effectiveness.
    - Identifies policies that work and why looking for replication opportunities between countries.



 Will leverage BCAP's newly launched best practices website (OCEAN – Online Code Environment and Advocacy Network) to develop country profiles for each of the APEC economies.

## **Energy Saving Windows**

Survey of Policies and Programs to Promote Advanced Window and Glazing Technologies in APEC Economies

- **Objective:** Compile information on recent efforts to reduce building energy use through advanced windows and glazing technologies in APEC economies. Survey and assess:
  - energy performance testing and rating practices for window technologies
  - policies and programs to promote such technologies in both new and existing buildings (as well as current obstacles to their uptake); and
  - the market status of such technologies in different climate zones.
- Status:
  - The RFP was issued
  - Proposals have been received and they are under review.

## **Cool Roofs in APEC Economies**

### Cool Roofs in APEC Economies: Review of Experience, Best Practices, and Potential Benefits

- **Objective:** Build capacity to implement cool roof technologies and policies in developing APEC member economies by:
  - reviewing experience in the region with cool rooftops
  - Identifying information on best practices
  - summarizing benefits in terms of reduced energy use and emissions
  - Estimating potential energy and GHG savings from cool roofs
  - Reviewing locally available materials and technologies

#### • Status:

- The RFP was issued
- Several proposals have been received and they are under review

## Energy and Water Efficiency in Water Supply

#### Energy and Water Efficiency in Water Supply: Practical Training on Proven Approaches

- **Objective:** Hold a training course for water utilities and municipalities in APEC economies to:
  - Explain the benefits of launching efficiency programs in their water supply and/or wastewater treatment facilities
  - Build capacity to carry out such programs
    - training
    - provision of guidance materials and tools
- Implementer: Alliance to Save Energy, USA (India Office)
- Status:
  - Workshop planning underway
  - Proposed location: Hanoi, Vietnam
  - <u>Proposed dates</u>: Early December 2009, or early January 2010

# **Transportation Projects (1)**

#### APEC Workshop on Policies that Promote Energy Efficiency in Transport, and follow-on activities

- Survey of Policies and Programs that Promote Fuel-Efficient Transport in APEC Economies (v.1) finalized September 2008
- APEC Workshop on Policies that Promote Energy Efficiency in Transport, 24-25 March 2009 at APEC Secretariat in Singapore. **Outputs**:
  - Action plan for energy efficiency in transportation, to be distributed to EGEE&C
  - Update of the Survey (nearing completion)
- *NEW: Self-funded follow-on activities:* 
  - Expand Survey with focus on policies to promote automotive fuel efficiency
  - Seminar on Transportation Energy Efficiency Improvement Potential

# **Transportation Projects (2)**

### New transportation proposals

- The US proposed 3 additional transport-related projects for consideration as joint Energy Working Group (EWG) and Transportation Working Group (TPT-WG) projects.
- **Status**: EWG endorsed all three in Santiago in April. TPT-WG considered them at their meeting in July and decided to propose all three in sequence:
  - Transport, Energy and Environmental Benefits of Intermodal Freight Strategies has been submitted. It is now under revision to respond to preliminary comments of the Budget and Management Committee (BMC)
  - Transport, Energy and Environmental Benefits of Transit Oriented
    Development will be submitted first funding round of 2010.
  - Transport, Energy and Environmental Benefits of Bus Rapid Transit will be submitted second funding round of 2010.
