

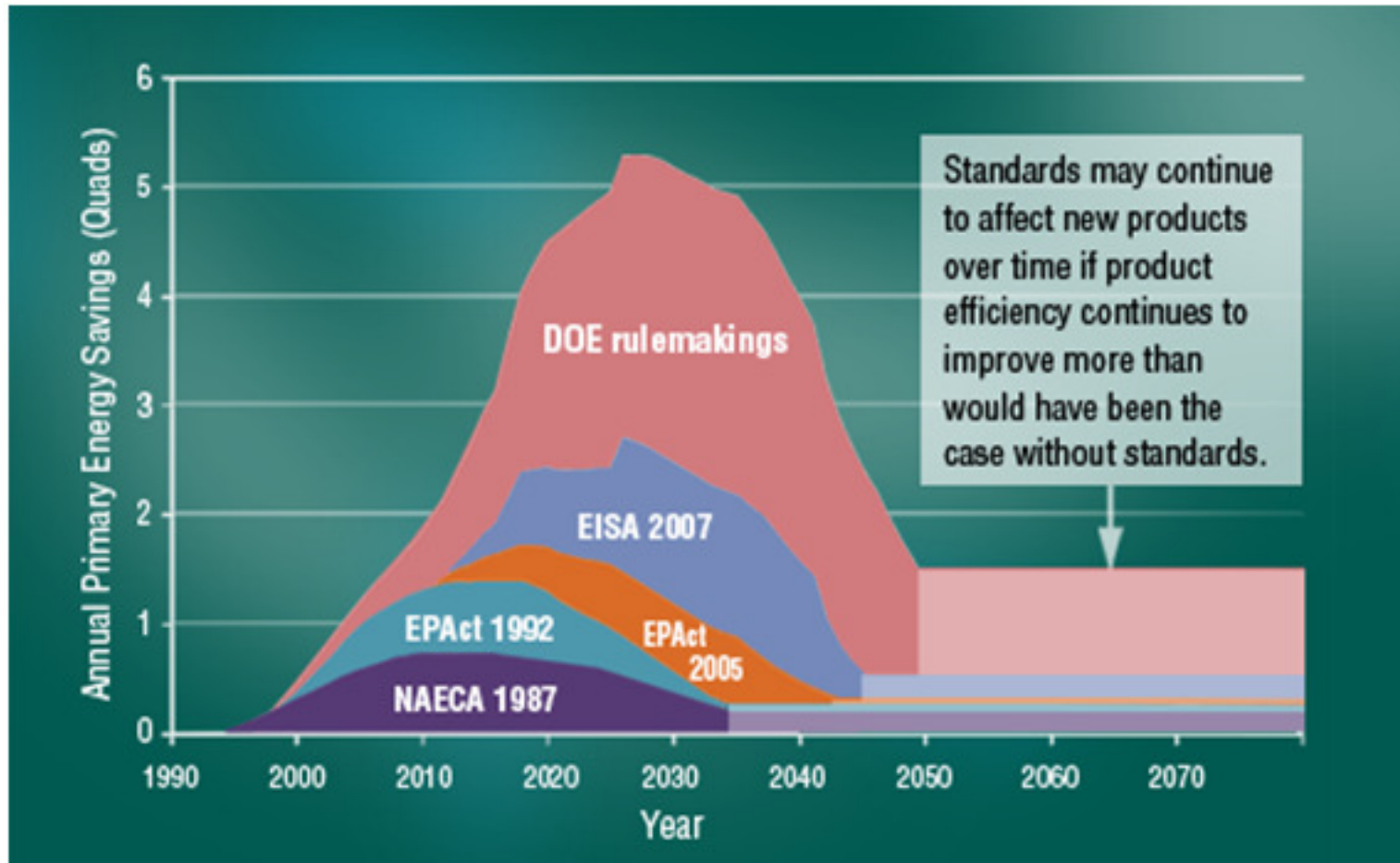

Impact of Federal Standards Activities

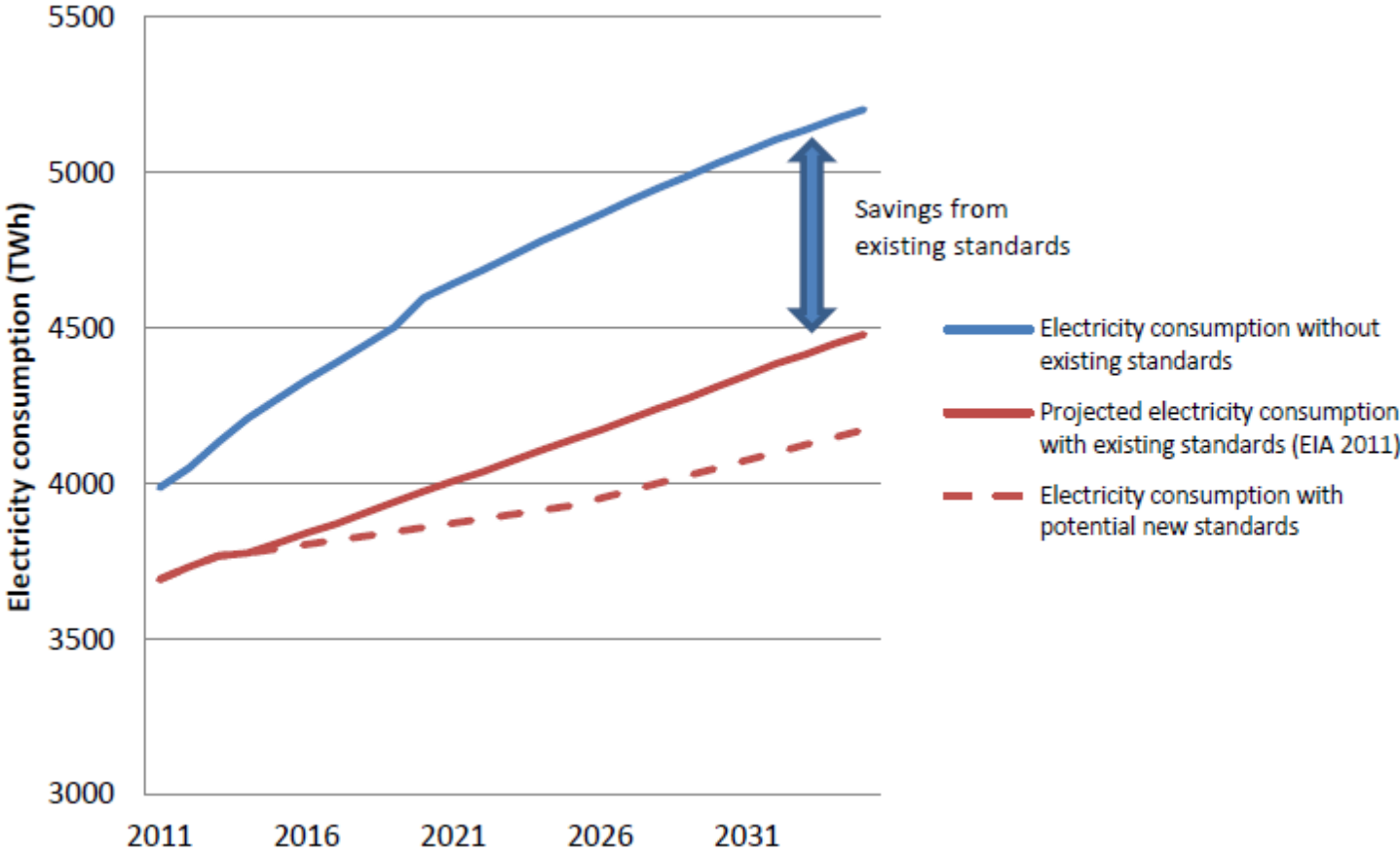

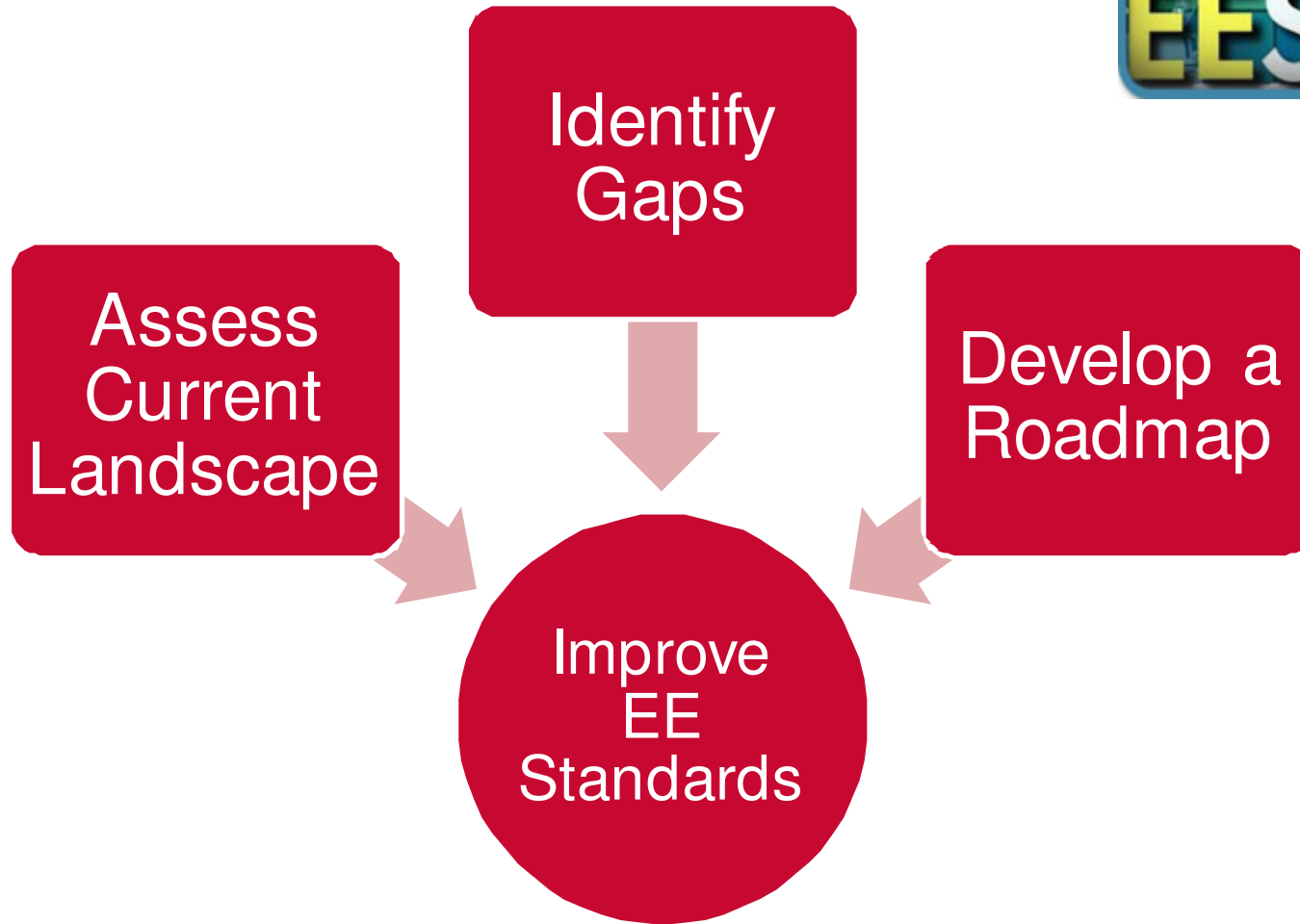

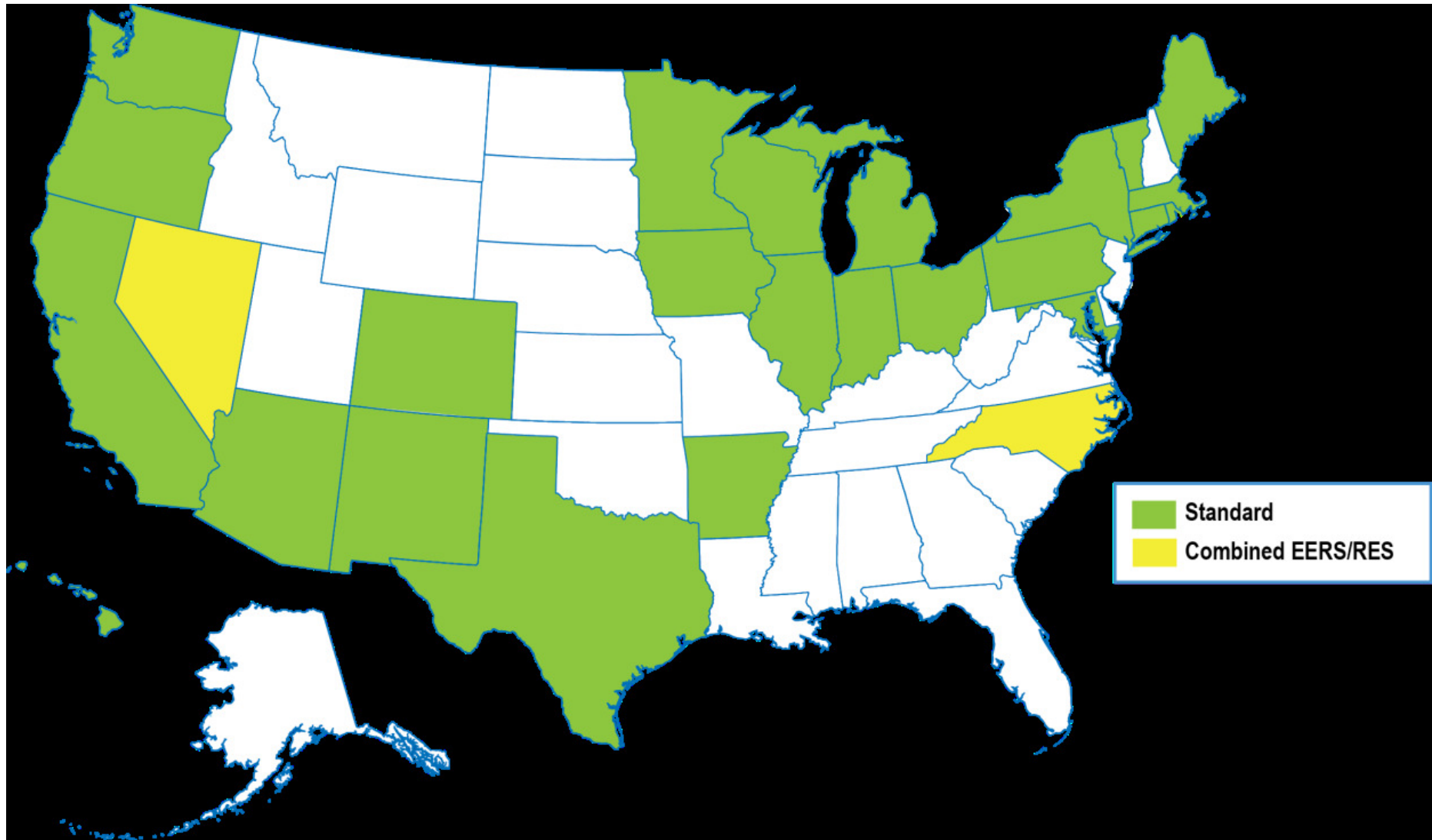
