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Letter from the SCE Chair

It is with great pleasure that I present the 2021 APEC Senior Officials' Report on Economic and Technical Cooperation.

The SOM Steering Committee on ECOTECH (SCE) and its sub-fora have adapted to living and working in the shadow of COVID-19, meeting virtually three times in 2021. The SCE and its sub-fora continued the important work of economic and technical cooperation guided by the APEC 2021 theme of "Join, Work, Grow. Together. Haumi ē, Hui ē, Tāiki ē." and the ECOTECH medium-term priorities.

The SCE continues to emphasize cross-fora collaboration, increasing collaborative work streams amongst SCE fora and between SCE fora and the Committee on Trade and Investment (CTI) and the Economic Committee (EC) and their fora. SCE's annual Committee of the Whole discussions are designed to help SCE sub-fora convenors and members identify to cross-fora issues and opportunities, and identify synergies between host economy priorities and fora work streams.

Consistent with the Putrajaya Vision 2040 and our commitment to the continuous improvement of APEC as an institution through good governance, the SCE has assessed all SCE sub-fora using the standardized fora assessment template endorsed in 2020. This allowed the SCE to have an entire suite of fora assessments prior to the expiration of Terms of Reference at the end of 2021. The fora assessment process also presents an opportunity for the SCE to monitor the progress and success of the sub-fora with the objective to ensure sub-fora's effective and timely implementation of the Putrajaya Vision 2040 as well as to strengthen APEC's relevancy in the post-COVID world.

This Report highlights some of the many activities of the SCE and its working groups and policy partnerships. These activities are guided by the ECOTECH medium term priorities. I am pleased to highlight that the efforts of SCE and its sub-fora in 2021 contributed to the development of key APEC deliverables in the areas of increasing inclusion and sustainability as well as pursuing innovation and a digitally-enabled recovery.

In presenting this Report, I wish to acknowledge the commitment, hard work, and contributions of APEC members, the SCE sub-fora and our dedicated fora Chairs and Lead Shepherds, and the 2021 Assessment Team. I would also like to thank the APEC Secretariat for the continued support to ensure the success of all SCE and SCE sub-fora meetings.

There remains a lot to do in the economic and technical cooperation agenda, including ensuring the ECOTECH medium term priorities align with the Putrajaya Vision. I look forward to continuing our work in 2022 and to working closely with the incoming SCE Chair.

Executive Summary

In 2021, the SOM Steering Committee on Economic and Technical Cooperation (SCE) held three meetings. The meetings were hosted by 2021 APEC host New Zealand and conducted via videoconference with Mr. Cherdchai Chaivaivid as Chair. Mr. Chaivaivid is Thailand's Senior Official for APEC. The SCE Vice Chair was Mr. Thomas Haidon from New Zealand. The SCE also organized the 16th annual SCE Committee of the Whole (SCE-COW) meeting and an informal meeting of SCE sub-fora Chairs and Lead Shepherds. In addition, the SCE also conducted business through intersessional discussion.

The SCE continues its central role in the administration of SCE sub-fora. SCE approved 15 Annual Work Plans. The SCE undertook assessment of 14 SCE sub-fora; completing assessment of all SCE sub-fora in 2021. The SCE reviewed and endorsed the 2022-2025 Terms of Reference of ten SCE sub-fora: ACTWG, ATCWG, EGILAT, HRDWG, OFWG, PPSTI, PPWE, TELWG, TPTWG, and TWG.

The SCE also carries out economic and technical cooperation activities through cross-cutting policy initiatives and projects in the Committee. Over the course of the year the SCE has conducted various workshops and published several reports. Specific information on these activities can be found in Section 1.

In addition to SCE's central role in the administration of SCE sub-fora, SCE also oversees and coordinates the work of SCE's 15 sub-fora. Some of the notable outcomes this year include:

The Health Working Group (HWG) and Life Sciences Innovation Forum (LSIF) co-contributed to the 11th APEC High Level Meeting (HLM10) on Health and the Economy with the theme "Making the Economic Case for Health Equity in a COVID-19 World".

The Agricultural Technical Cooperation Working Group (ATCWG) and the Ocean and Fisheries Working Group (OFWG) supported New Zealand in its hosting of the 6th APEC Ministerial Meeting on Food Security.

The Policy Partnership on Women and the Economy (PPWE) supported New Zealand in its hosting of the Women and the Economy Forum in September 2021, which included a High-Level Policy Dialogue on "Women's Economic Empowerment Beyond COVID-19".

The Small and Medium Enterprises Working Group (SMEWG) contributed to the 27th APEC SME Ministerial Meeting (SMEMM) held in October.

Ten APEC economies made financial contributions to the APEC Support Fund's various sub-funds. The SCE also endorsed the establishment of the Sub-Fund on APEC Cooperation on Combatting COVID-19 and Economic Recovery.

A discussion of the above and other highlights and priorities are set out in Section 2.

Section 3 gives an overview of all sub-fora governance documents. Each forum also reports on projects, both funded by APEC and self-funded by economies, undertaken in 2021 through Fora in

Action tables. The tables include information on which projects and other initiatives of SCE sub-fora addressed the ECOTECH medium term priorities. Additionally, the Fora in Action tables include the achievements of each SCE sub-fora since the 2020 Report.

Recommendations

The following recommendations are proposed to the 2021 APEC Ministerial Meeting (AMM):

- 1. Note the 2021 Senior Officials' Report on Economic and Technical Cooperation;
- 2. Welcome the achievements of the SCE Working Groups and Policy Partnerships;
- 3. Welcome 2021 contributions to the APEC Support Funds various sub-funds from Australia; Canada; China; Hong Kong, China; Japan; Korea; Malaysia; New Zealand; Chinese Taipei; and the United States.

1. Introduction

In 2021, the SCE was chaired by Mr. Cherdchai Chaivaivid, APEC Senior Official for Thailand. The SCE Vice Chair was Mr. Thomas Haidon, for New Zealand.

The Committee met on three occasions during 2021 and accomplished the following:

- a. assessed fourteen (14) SCE sub-fora;
- b. recommended renewal of eleven (11) SCE sub-fora;
- c. discussed ECOTECH policy initiatives and project proposals;
- d. coordinated the work of SCE sub-fora to facilitate recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic and ensure alignment with the APEC Putrajaya Vision 2040;
- e. facilitated the work of SCE sub-fora by providing direction on Work Plans, Strategic Plans, and Terms of Reference.

The first SCE meeting in 2021 was held virtually on 5 March 2021. The SCE discussed its 2021 SCE Work Plan and agreed to continue discussions intersessionally (2021/SOM2/SCE/002). The SCE decided to delay the medium-term ECOTECH Review until 2022, to better align medium-term ECOTECH priorities with the forthcoming Putrajaya Vision Implementation Plan. The 2021 Assessment Team was formed of past, and current SCE Chair economies (New Zealand and Thailand) and the volunteer economies Australia, Canada, China, Russia, and United States. Australia and Canada further volunteered to be the Assessment Team lead economies. The Assessment Team tabled four Standardized Assessment Reports and provided an update of the Fora Assessment Program. The Standardized Fora Assessment Program is discussed further in section 2.5.

The annual SCE Committee of the Whole (SCE-COW) was held virtually on 4 March 2021. It was attended by 21 APEC member economies and 15 SCE sub-fora convenors or their representatives. The SCE endorsed the work plans of six SCE sub-fora: Experts' Group on Illegal Logging and Associated Trade; Emergency Preparedness Working Group; Policy Partnership for Science, Technology and Innovation; Small and Medium Enterprises Working Group; Telecommunications and Information Working Group; and Tourism Working Group.

The SCE oversaw New Zealand's self-funded project event on 3 March 2021 for *Case Studies on Advancing Inclusive Economic Growth: Understanding and Valuing Indigenous Economies within APEC.* This event and APEC publication of the same name sought to support statisticians, researchers and policy makers within the APEC region to understand and value indigenous economies in their respective economies.

Intersessionally, the SCE endorsed 2021 SCE Work Plan. The SCE also intersessionally endorsed the 2021 work plans for Anti-Corruption and Transparency Experts' Working Group; Agricultural Technical Cooperation Working Group; Energy Working Group; Health Working Group; Human Resources Development Working Group; Oceans and Fisheries Working Group; Policy Partnership on Women and the Economy; and Transportation Working Group. In addition, the SCE also approved the Case Studies on Advancing Inclusive Economic Growth: Understanding and Valuing Indigenous Economies for publication intersessionally. Finally, the SCE endorsed China's proposal to create an

ASF Sub-Fund for APEC Cooperation on Combatting COVID-19 and Economic Recovery (CCER) and the Eligibility Criteria and Guidelines for Accessing the APEC Support Fund Sub-fund for CCER.

The second SCE meeting was held virtually on 27 May 2021. The SCE Assessment Team tabled five Standardized Fora Assessment Reports for discussion and provided an update of the Fora Assessment Program. The SCE also approved for publication of the *Case Study: Best Practices in Smart Cities in a Digital Age* report. This self-funded project, initiated by Chile and China, examined case studies to offer member economies useful knowledge and reference material on successful practices and innovative solutions implemented by other member economies who have overcome similar challenges. The SCE also discussed possible future follow-up work to the recently completed Indigenous Economies and Smart Cities projects.

In June, the SCE oversaw the project event for China and Papua New Guinea's self-funded project *Inclusive Digital Society: Alleviating Poverty and Improving Living Standards through Increased Economic Growth.* Participants discussed policies and practices related to digitally enabled poverty alleviation and improving living standards, including measures to build digital infrastructure and improve digital literacy, use digital technology to help companies, and apply digital technologies in energy, education, and medical industries.

Intersessionally, the SCE endorsed New Zealand's self-funded project proposal on *Understanding the Economic Impact of COVID-19 on Indigenous Peoples*.

In August, the SCE oversaw a project event for New Zealand's self-funded project *Understanding the Economic Impact of COVID-19 on Indigenous Peoples*. Participants discussed the economic impacts, opportunities, successes and challenges of COVID-19 facing indigenous peoples including on areas such as indigenous household income, employment, business viability and International trade. Participants considered the role of traditional knowledge in response efforts, capacity building and engagement best practice principles.

On 27 August 2021, New Zealand hosted SCE 3 virtually. The SCE Assessment Team tabled five Standardized Fora Assessment Reports for discussion and provided the final update of the Fora Assessment Program for the year.

Intersessionally, the SCE approved for publication the *Achieving the APEC 2020 Forest Cover Goal* report. The SCE also intersessionally endorsed the *Report of the APEC Secretariat Executive Director* on the Alignment of Fora Work Plans with APEC's Overall Vision and Objectives 2021 and the SCE Report on Synergies within the ECOTECH Agenda 2021. The SCE intersessionally endorsed the Oceans and Fisheries 2021-2023 Strategic Plan and the Counter Terrorism Working Group's 2021 Work Plan. The SCE approved for publication the *Understanding the Economic Impact of COVID-19* on *Indigenous Peoples* report. The SCE intersessionally endorsed the Emergency Preparedness Working Group's 2022-2025 Terms of Reference.

2. 2021 Highlights and Priorities

2.1 Host Economy Priorities

During the year, the SCE and its sub-fora furthered the 2021 priorities of Increasing Inclusion and Sustainability for Recovery as well as Pursuing Innovation and a Digitally-Enabled Recovery.

a. Increasing Inclusion and Sustainability for Recovery

The SCE has led APEC's cross-cutting work on increasing inclusion and sustainability for recovery.

During 2021, the SCE oversaw the implementation of Case Studies on Advancing Inclusive Economic Growth: Understanding and Valuing Indigenous Economies within APEC. The project sought to increase inclusive economic growth related to indigenous communities allowing APEC to get to the heart of some of the core economic challenges for APEC economies. In a time when all APEC economies are grappling with the impacts and recovery strategies associated with the global COVID-19 pandemic, the project facilitated the discussion and the pursuit of data to evidence how economies within indigenous communities contribute to inclusive economic growth. The SCE published the report Case Studies on Advancing Inclusive Economic Growth: Understanding and Valuing Indigenous Economies within APEC in April.

The SCE further oversaw the implementation of *Understanding the Economic Impact of COVID-19* on *Indigenous Peoples*, which sought to build on the outcomes of the Case Studies project. The workshop focused on the economic impacts, opportunities, successes and challenges of COVID-19 facing indigenous peoples including on areas such as indigenous household income, employment, business viability and international trade. It also considered the role of traditional knowledge in response efforts, capacity building and engagement best practice principles. The SCE published the *Understanding Economic Impact of COVID-19 on Indigenous Peoples* report in October.

The Agricultural Technical Cooperation Working Group (ATCWG) has lead in the development of the provisions on the "minimizing food loss and waste" key action area of the Food Security Roadmap as well as its implementation. The ATCWG has collaborated with the Policy Partnership on Food Security (PPFS) through workshops on reducing food loss and waste. ATCWG's workshops such as on the practices of circular agriculture also align with the key action areas of the Food Security Roadmap.

The Experts' Group on Illegal Logging and Associated Trade (EGILAT) and the APEC Policy Support Unit (PSU) published *The Compendium of Resources for the Facilitation of the Trade and Distribution of Legally Harvested Forest Products in the APEC Region.* The Compendium identifies and organizes a range of resources that can provide information on risk profiles, legal information, resources, and tools to facilitate the trade of legal forest products.

The Policy Partnership for Women and the Economy conducted the 6^{th} APEC Business Efficiency and Success Target (BEST) Award as a hybrid event with the theme of "Women's Business: Driver of Inclusive Recovery". The awards aim to recognize women entrepreneurs in seven categories including those providing Indigenous community support.

The Transportation Working Group (TPTWG) published the *Disruptive Technologies and the Changing Nature of Work in the Transportation Sector* report. This project and report aimed to build the capacity of APEC economies to strategically plan for and adapt to the emergence of these new technologies by broadening knowledge on the subject, and providing high-level recommendations on

how to increase opportunities for underrepresented groups while mitigating the negative impacts on displaced workers. The report specifically focused on women and the disabled as workers, who are underrepresented in traditional transportation occupations.

b. Pursuing Innovation and a Digitally-Enabled Recovery

The Human Resources Development Working Group (HRDWG) conducted 2021 APEC Initiative on Closing the Digital Skills Gap: A Focus on Measurement and Digital Readiness. The project sought to help APEC economies better understand 1) the size of the digital skills gap and 2) their level of readiness to address closing the digital skills gap. This will help identify workforce opportunities for individuals in APEC economies as well as encourage collaboration among universities, governments, and employers to close the digital skills gap by 2030. The HRDWG also conducted the 10th Conference on Higher Education. The Conference sought to address three primary education needs including specifically providing a platform for researchers from the fields of natural science and IT sector to discuss scientific trends in the respective areas and find common ground for joint research.

The Telecommunications and Information Working Group (TELWG) conducted several workshops in support of a digitally-enabled recovery including *Report and Workshop on Network Virtualisation*, *Disaggregated Networks and Open Telecommunications Architecture in APEC* which explored virtualized and/or disaggregated telecommunications networks, as well as open architecture specifications in Radio Access Networks (RAN). The TELWG also conducted *Building a Digital Ready Society* and produced an accompanying report seeking to enhance the mutual learning and understanding on how digital readiness initiatives can aid society to better access technology as well as equip citizens with the skills that are needed to use that technology.

The TPTWG held a thematic session on 'Facilitating mobility integration through technological innovation' to discuss the impacts of 'Mobility as a Service' on reducing transport emissions, climate change, social equity and provision of safe and affordable accessibility for women and other vulnerable or traditionally underserved transportation users.

2.2 La Serena Roadmap for Women and Inclusive Growth

Following from the endorsement of the La Serena Roadmap for Women and Inclusive Growth by APEC Ministers in 2019, the Policy Partnership on Women and the Economy (PPWE) developed the La Serena Roadmap Implementation Plan in 2020. The Implementation Plan provides direction to APEC fora and sub-fora in determining current and new work streams that may contribute to fulfilling the Roadmap's key action areas and meeting its targets. It also establishes a process for monitoring, reporting and reviewing progress that will be overseen by Senior Officials. The PPWE engages with other APEC fora and sub-fora to support collective efforts toward implementing the Roadmap.

Beginning in January 2021, the PPWE worked with fora across APEC to develop their Key Action Frameworks (KAF) as outlined in the La Serena Roadmap for Women and Inclusive Growth Implementation Plan. The respective fora use those KAFs to report their progress on the La Serena Roadmap for Women and Inclusive Growth.

This year marked the first reporting for the La Serena Roadmap for Women and Inclusive Growth. At SCE 3, the PPWE Chair presented a summary of how APEC's work is significantly contributing to the improvement of outcomes for women and girls. As of June 2021, over 100 initiatives have been completed or are underway across sixteen working groups. These are in addition to the initiatives being driven out of the PPWE working group. The PPWE Chair shared that in spite of the challenges of COVID-19, women's economic empowerment is being thoughtfully addressed across APEC workstreams, in well-targeted and constructive actions. The next reporting will be in 2023

2.3 Implementing the MRT Statement on Safe Passage

Arising from the June 5 Ministers Responsible for Trade Joint Statement, Ministers and Senior Officials requested APEC follow up on a number of issues relating to better support of air crews, facilitation of business mobility across the region, and advance of discussions on digital solutions to facilitate safe travel in the region. These issues span several sub-fora in both SCE and the Committee and Trade and Investment (CTI).

To better advance these discussions and bring about tangible outcomes, the SCE Chair, along with the CTI Chair, convened a meeting of relevant SCE and CTI sub-fora convenors on 10 September. The Convenor of ABAC's Reopening Borders for Safe and Seamless Travel taskforce, Mr. Lam Yi Young also joined the meeting. During the meeting, the convenors, or their representatives of the Business Mobility Group, Health Working Group, Life Sciences Innovation Forum, Transportation Working Group and Tourism Working Group provided updates on work underway in their respective fora to implement the MRT Joint Statement on Safe Passage. In addition, the SCE and CTI Chairs, along with the sub-fora convenors and ABAC representative discussed ways that APEC and ABAC can better work together to implement the MRT Joint Statement on Safe Passage.

2.4 Fora Administration

a. Making Recommendations to SOM on the Terms of Reference of SCE Fora

In accordance with the SCE Terms of Reference, the SCE has the mandate to "review the role and operation of Working Groups and Task Forces with a view to making recommendations to the SOM on establishing, merging, disbanding or reorienting" such working groups and task forces. In 2021, the SCE discussed how to manage the expiration of all SCE sub-fora Terms of Reference in 2021. The SCE assessed 14 sub-fora using a standardized template, which allowed the SCE to make recommendations on renewal to Senior Officials. Please see Table 1 for an overview of fora administration.

b. Approving Strategic Plans

In 2021, the SCE approved one Strategic Plan: Telecommunications and Information Working Group 2021-2024.

c. Approving Annual Work Plans

The Terms of Reference of SCE, as reconfirmed in 2020, mandates SCE to "assess and direct realignment of individual work plans of Working Groups and SOM Policy Partnerships with the APEC-wide medium-term ECOTECH priorities and annual objectives as outlined in the ECOTECH framework" and stipulates that "to this purpose, all Working Groups and Policy Partnerships should submit their strategic and annual work plans to the SCE no later than three weeks prior to SOM 1 for consideration at the SCE-Committee of the Whole." Fifteen work plans were submitted and fourteen work plans were approved by SCE in 2021 (as reflected in Table 1).

At SCE2 in 2021, the Executive Director of the APEC Secretariat presented a report, *Alignment of Fora Work Plans with APEC's Overall Vision and Objectives* (2021/SOM2/SCE/002) which noted that most SCE sub-fora focused their activities to respond to the mandates given to them by the Leaders and Ministers. Many sub-fora, such as Agricultural Technical Cooperation Working Group; Health Working Group; Oceans and Fisheries Working Group; Policy Partnership for Women and the Economy; and Small and Medium Enterprises Working Group specifically cite recent instructions of Ministers. A number of these also refer to 2021 APEC priorities. Most notably, all work plans also make linkages between their specific activities and the relevant ECOTECH Medium Term Priorities, which is facilitated by continued use of a template.

2.5 Revised, Standardized Fora Assessment System

In 2006, the SCE was mandated to conduct a review of APEC working groups and task forces and make recommendations to Senior Officials on establishing, merging, disbanding and reorienting these bodies. Ministers endorsed the recommendations of the SCE review and instructed the SCE to continue efforts to improve the operation and work of its fora (2006/CSOM/14). A program of independent assessments was then developed to evaluate all SCE working groups and task forces every four years and support periodic review processes.

In 2016, the SCE Chair proposed, and members accepted, to conduct a review of the Independent Assessment program. Delegations shared the view that for assessments should be undertaken in the view of providing broader organizational perspectives and facilitating possible rationalization. Delegations also noted the lack of understanding of APEC among certain assessors, uneven follow-up on recommendations and inconsistencies between the review of fora Terms of References and their assessment schedules. Following this, the Secretariat presented a discussion paper to SCE2 (2016/SOM2/SCE/003), which addressed a number of issues, including quality, focus, schedules across different review and monitoring processes, post-assessment measures and attendant financial/administrative burdens.

At SCE3 in 2016, the SCE approved the Decisions on Fora Assessment as proposed by the Chair (2016/SOM3/SCE/011), the main elements of which include developments of a standardized program for assessments, the establishment of an Assessment Team comprising the representatives from the preceding, current, and subsequent SCE Chairing economies, as well as any other volunteering economies with the assistance from the Secretariat; further follow-up by the Assessment Team on the recommendations; and an optional Comprehensive Fora Review following a full cycle of assessments on all the SCE fora.

In 2018, a standardized template for fora assessment was endorsed by SCE (2018/SOM1/SCE/0024). This template was then used to assess four SCE sub-fora in 2018 (as per Table 1). Upon receipt of the four fora assessments, the Assessment Team determined that the information contained in the reports was not sufficient to allow them to make any recommendations to SCE.

At SCE 1 in 2019, there was discussion regarding the current standardized for a assessment program. Several economies expressed concern regarding the expense of the current program, the length of the reports produced, and the overall usefulness of the resulting reports. A decision was taken to pause the program while the Assessment Team discussed alternative methods of for assessment.

In 2020 the Assessment Team proposed a new standardized report template. This new standardized report template was endorsed at SCE 3. The first sub-fora assessed using the template was the SMEWG with results tabled at SCE4.

By SCE 3 in 2021, all 15 SCE sub-fora had been assessed using the template designed by the Assessment Team in 2020. The Assessment Team used the reports to develop recommendations for SCE on renewal of SCE sub-fora, which were tabled at SCE 3 (2021/SOM3/SCE/002).

2.6 Cross-Fora Collaboration

Increasing cross-fora collaboration has been under discussion in recent years. A 16th meeting of SCE Fora Chairs and Lead Shepherds (SCE-Committee of the Whole) was held on 4 March 2021 in virtual format. Chairs and Lead Shepherds or their representatives from all 15 of the SCE fora participated. The presence of Chairs, Lead Shepherds or their representatives increased their interactions with each other and Senior Officials, leading to useful practical suggestions for collaborating with other APEC fora. At SCE 2 2021, the APEC Secretariat introduced its report, "SCE Report on Synergies within the ECOTECH Agenda" (2021/SOM2/SCE/003). To further underscore the importance of cross-fora collaboration, fora are required to report on their cross-fora collaborations in annual fora reports. In addition, the standardized fora assessment program also measures data and indicators relating to cross-fora collaboration. In 2021, SCE and its sub-fora have 200+ projects in implementation. Of those projects, over 30% of them include some manner of cross-fora collaboration. In addition, many sub-fora hold joint meetings with other SCE sub-fora as well as with EC and CTI and its sub-fora.

2.7 APEC Support Fund

In 2004, Ministers endorsed the Australian proposal to set up the APEC Support Fund (ASF) to serve as a flexible funding mechanism. The ASF aims to meet the capacity building needs for developing economy members in APEC's agreed high priority sectors for economic and technical cooperation. Since its inception, the fund has received contributions from many economies.

In 2021, three new ASF sub-funds were established: the Sub-Fund on Strengthening Economic Legal Infrastructure; the Sub-Fund on APEC Cooperation on Combatting COVID-19 and Economic Recovery; and the Sub-Fund on Enhanced APEC Agenda for Structural Reform.

Voluntary contributions by APEC members to the ASF and its sub-funds in 2021 (as of 15 October 2021) were provided or committed by ten economies: Australia; Canada; China; Hong Kong, China; Japan; Korea; Malaysia; New Zealand; Chinese Taipei; and the United States.

 - Coordinate and supervise all ECOTECH-related Working Groups and Policy Partnerships, including reviewing and recommending any fora's ToR revision to SOM;
 - Review the operation and effectiveness of the SCE;
 - Provide policy guidance on the ECOTECH agenda in the development of sub-fora strategic plans;
 - Continue to implement SCE's Decision on Standardized Fora Assessment program;
 - Determine eligibility and score concept notes applying for funding under ASF sub-funds assigned to the responsibility of the SCE; and,
 - Consolidate the SCE Fora Reports and prepare annual SOM Report on ECOTECH to Ministers.
- 2. Strengthening coordination among and across sub-fora
 - Coordinate the efforts and promote cross-fora collaboration of SCE sub-fora in implementing the 2040 Putrajaya Vision;
 - Promote cross-fora collaboration across APEC sub-fora, including through implementation of the 2016 Recommendations on Cross-Fora Collaboration together with the 2017 APEC Guidelines on Promoting Cross-Fora Collaboration;
 - Review and consider any possible options to make the SCE and SCE COW arrangements more effective; and
 - Supervise or coordinate cross-cutting issues and specific initiatives assigned to SCE.
- 3. Expected Outcomes/Deliverables for 2021
 - Implementation of Standardized Fora Assessment Program, including convening of the Assessment Team for 2021;
 - Consideration of new ways to strengthen cross for collaboration through the SCE process;
 - Approval of the SCE sub-fora's annual work plans;
 - Continue oversight of SCE projects and initiatives (list on following page);
 - Review and approval of the Strategic Plans for those sub-fora with expiring strategic plans;

- Review and recommendation of the revised ToRs of certain sub-fora to SOM, including in connection with governance reforms agreed by SOM in 2017;
- Submission of the annual SOM Report on ECOTECH to Ministers at AMM 2021; and
- Review and make recommendation to SOM on those sub-fora with expiring Terms of Reference

SCE Report on Synergies within the ECOTECH Agenda 2021

Background

- 1. The SCE has tasked "the Secretariat to undertake a strategic assessment of synergies within the ECOTECH agenda after SOM1 and provide recommendations to SCE2 about gaps that may require SCE attention or direction" (point 7 of SCE Report on Improving ECOTECH in APEC (2013/SOM3/030)).
- 2. The first report by the APEC Secretariat (2014/SOM2/SCE/004) was submitted to the SCE2 in 2014. The second report was presented to the SCE2 in 2015.
- 3. The 2021 report has been rationalised somewhat from previous versions. The fora work plans are not attached. One is invited to review the 2021 Work Plans of the SCE sub-fora on the SCE ACS page. In addition, the template has been refined in recent years to request sub-fora to specify which other sub-fora or organisations it plans to collaborate with, and how. Similar reporting is sought in the template for annual Fora Reports submitted later in the APEC year.

Review of the annual work plans of the SCE fora

- 4. The APEC Secretariat analysed thirteen (13) sub-fora work plans: ACTWG, ATCWG, EGILAT, EPWG, EWG, HRDWG, HWG, OFWG, PPSTI, PPWE, SMEWG, TELWG, and TWG submitted as of 29 April 2021. The Secretariat analysis came to the following broad conclusions:
 - SCE sub-fora identified over 130 areas of potential cross-fora collaboration.
 - Potential collaboration is being identified with other SCE sub-fora as well as with the sub-fora of the Economic Committee, the Committee on Trade and Investment, and the Finance Ministers Process/Senior Finance Officials' Meeting.
 - Collaboration is not confined to the same or the more obvious partners but rather is diverse, and often differs from project to project.
 - The most active sub-fora in terms of collaboration are PPWE and SMEWG. The sub-fora with the fewest self-reported collaborations are ACTWG and EGILAT.
 - A number of SCE sub-fora identify potential collaboration with external partners, including international and regional organisations such as the United Nations, World Bank, Asian Development Bank, INTERPOL, International Energy Agency, ILO, WHO and OECD, or non-governmental organisations such as the International Air Transport Association and Transparency International, to name but a few.
 - Only two work plans have explicitly identified potential collaborations with ABAC.
 There likely is scope for more frequent collaboration with ABAC as well as ASEAN and
 Pacific Islands Forum Secretariat, given their respective roles within the broader APEC
 process.

Discussion on how to promote cross-fora collaboration

5. At SCE3 in 2016, SCE members adopted eight recommendations to promote cross-fora collaboration (see 2016/SOM3/SCE/002).

- 6. The SCE Chair and the Secretariat together with the SCE fora have been implementing these recommendations since SCE3 of 2016. In 2021, a thematic discussion focused on key fora deliverables and cross-fora opportunities was at the heart of the SCE-COW agenda. The CTI, EC, BMC, ABAC, and SFOM Chairs were invited to attend the 2021 SCE-COW. The Secretariat maintains all key documents of the SCE fora (ie Terms of References, Strategic Plans, annual Work Plans and annual Fora Reports) on the APEC Collaboration System (ACS). The virtual format of APEC in 2021 has increased participation by SCE sub-fora conveners, with attendance by all conveners for the first time since 2017.
- 7. The completion of the Putrajaya Vision Implementation Plan may offer an opportunity for the SCE to examine the eight recommendations to promote cross-fora collaborations and consider if additional recommendations are necessary.

Report of the APEC Secretariat Executive Director on the Alignment of Fora Work Plans with APEC's Overall Vision and Objectives 2021

Introduction

- 1. In line with the recommendations for *Strengthening Economic and Technical Cooperation in APEC* issued in 2010, the APEC Secretariat Executive Director provides an annual report on how SCE sub-fora work plans address APEC's overall vision and objectives.
- 2. The SCE sub-fora annual work plans are tabled at the annual SCE-Committee of the Whole Meeting (SCE-COW) seeking approval in accordance with the recommendations of the 2010 ECOTECH Report.
- 3. The 2021 alignment report considers how well the activities set out in the work plans align with the priorities established by Leaders and Ministers and the annual 2021 APEC priorities.
- 4. The continuation of the COVID-19 pandemic has led to continued region-wide travel disruptions as well as a shift of focus on work toward COVID-19 related issues.

Status of Work Plan Submission

- 5. The SCE Terms of Reference stipulate that Working Groups and Policy Partnerships should submit their annual work plans three weeks prior to the annual SCE-COW on the margins of SCE1. The APEC Secretariat analyzed [thirteen (13)] sub-fora work plans: Anti-Corruption Working Group; Agricultural Technical Cooperation Working Group; Experts Group on Illegal Logging and Associated Trade; Emergency Preparedness Working Group; Energy Working Group; Human Resources Development Working Group; Health Working Group; Oceans and Fisheries Working Group; Policy Partnership for Science, Technology, and Innovation; Policy Partnership for Women and the Economy; Small and Medium Enterprises Working Group; Telecommunications and Information Working Group; and Tourism Working Group as of 30 April 2021.
- 6. The work plans of Emergency Preparedness Working Group; Experts' Group on Illegal Logging and Associated Trade; Policy Partnership on Science, Technology, and Innovation; Small and Medium Enterprises Working Group; Telecommunications Working Group; and the Tourism Working Group were submitted at SCE-COW as they were endorsed by the respective sub-fora.
- 7. The SCE sub-fora are asked to develop their work plans in accordance with a template approved at SCE2 2016. In 2017, guidance was added to the template to encourage identification of gender-related initiatives or aspects thereof. Additional guidance was provided in 2021to focus reporting on those deliverables that align with the 2021 priorities.
- 8. The Secretariat conducted an analysis of the work plans and came to the following general conclusions:

Alignment of Work Plans with Broader APEC Objectives

- The majority of SCE sub-fora focused their activities to respond to the mandates given to them by the Leaders and Ministers. The majority of sub-fora, such as ATCWG, HWG, OFWG and PPWE, and SMEWG specifically cite recent instructions of Ministers.
- 11 out of 13 refer to 2021 APEC priorities.
- All work plans also make linkages between their specific activities and the relevant ECOTECH Medium Term Priorities, which is facilitated by the template.

• 10 of the 15 work plans have specific references to the La Serena Roadmap for Women and Inclusive Growth and gendered perspective projects or work streams.

Planning Elements (Cross-fora collaboration, Capacity Building and Expected Deliverables)

- All submitted work plans identify some degree of collaboration with other sub-fora on crosscutting topics. The Secretariat presents its analysis in a separate paper.
- Most initiatives and projects have been identified as capacity building, which is in keeping with ECOTECH priorities.
- Ten of the work plans responded to the work plan guidance seeking identification of genderrelated initiatives or aspect thereof.
- There remains room for improvement amongst sub-fora work plans focusing on deliverables, or outputs and outcomes, which advance APEC priorities, rather than on activities and routine administrative issues.
- Reforms to the SCE-COW arrangements have aided a focus on concrete deliverables.

Executive Director Comment

- 9. Upon completion of the Putrajaya Vision Implementation Plan revision of the work plan template could help groups focus on those areas of the Vision and Implementation Plan that are most pertinent to their respective fora leading to clear concise work plans.
- 10. A continued emphasis on expected deliverables in work plan preparation could aide Senior Officials and conveners in maximizing capacity building through cross-fora collaboration.
