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Letter from the SCE Chair

It is my pleasure to present the 2022 APEC Senior Officials' Report on Economic and Technical Cooperation.

The SOM Steering Committee on ECOTECH (SCE) and its sub-fora were able to resume in-person meetings after an extended period of exclusively virtual gatherings, due to COVID-19. The SCE met virtually in February for its first meeting and then in hybrid form with some members joining online and others in-person for the second and third SCE meetings in 2022. The SCE and its sub-fora continued the important work of economic and technical cooperation guided by the APEC 2022 theme of "Open. Connect. Balance." and the ECOTECH medium-term priorities, which underwent a refresh this year to better align the Committee's work with APEC's broader efforts to achieve the Putrajaya Vision 2040, including through the Aotearoa Plan of Action.

Similarly, the SCE sub fora worked to ensure that governance documents, including workplans, terms of reference and strategic plans were synchronised with the Putrajaya Vision and its companion document the Aotearoa Plan of Action

In 2022 the SCE continues to emphasize cross-fora collaboration and engagement with a broad range of stakeholders, including two policy dialogues and the launch of an award centred on the Bio-Circular-Green (BCG) economy model – a post pandemic growth strategy focused on the efficient use of resources, the maintenance and restoration of ecosystems and the reduction of waste in a bid to build a system where economy and business can thrive.

This Report highlights some of the many activities of the SCE and its working groups and policy partnerships. I am pleased to highlight that the efforts of SCE and its sub-fora in 2022 contributed to the development of key APEC deliverables in the areas of increasing sustainable economic growth and supporting the recovery of small and medium sized enterprises from the impacts of COVID-19 within our region.

In presenting this Report, I wish to acknowledge the commitment, hard work, and contributions of APEC members, the SCE sub-fora and our dedicated fora Chairs and Lead Shepherds. I would also like to thank the APEC Secretariat for the continued support to ensure the success of all SCE and SCE sub-fora meetings.

There remains a lot to do in the economic and technical cooperation agenda, including ensuring that the SCE is well positioned to meet its first biennial reporting requirements for the Aotearoa Plan of Action in 2023. I look forward to continuing our work in 2023 and to working closely with the incoming SCE Chair.

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Executive Summary

In 2022, the SOM Steering Committee on Economic and Technical Cooperation (SCE) held three meetings hosted by Thailand, with the first SCE meeting (SCE 1) conducted via videoconference and all subsequent meetings held in person with virtual participation. Mr. Matt Murray, the United States' Senior Official for APEC, served as Chair, with Mr. Pruthipong Poonthrigobol of Thailand serving as SCE Vice Chair. The SCE also virtually held the 17th annual SCE Committee of the Whole (SCE-COW) meeting and an informal meeting of SCE sub-fora Chairs and Lead Shepherds. In addition, the SCE conducted business through intersessional discussions and exchanges.

The SCE continued its central role in the administration of SCE sub-fora, approving the annual work plans of all 14 SCE sub-fora as well as endorsing 5 Strategic Plans for the following sub-fora: The Agricultural Technical Cooperation Working Group (ATCWG); the Experts Group on Illegal Logging and Associated Trade (EGILAT); Human Resources Development Working Group (HRDWG) the Policy Partnership on Science, Technology and Innovation (PPSTI) and the Transportation Working Group (TPTWG).

Over the course of the year the SCE conducted various workshops, published several reports and carried out economic and technical cooperation activities through cross-cutting policy initiatives and projects despite an inability to achieve consensus on the final version of the 2022 SCE Annual Work Plan. Specific information on the year in review, including these activities can be found in **Section 1**.

A refresh of the ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities was undertaken to first align and then integrate the existing ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities with key areas of economic and technical cooperation outlined in the APEC Putrajaya Vision 2040 (APV2040) and its implementation plan, the Aotearoa Plan of Action (APA).

In addition to SCE's central role in the administration of SCE sub-fora, SCE also oversaw and coordinated the work of SCE's 14 sub-fora. APEC fora and sub-fora are focused on weaving the Putrajaya Vision 2040's goals into their outcomes. SCE, as one of the major APEC committees, shoulders the responsibility of implementing the Putrajaya Vision including through the Aotearoa Plan of Action as well as giving guidance to its sub-fora in their implementation process. SCE and its sub-fora have contributed to the implementation of Putrajaya Vision by conducting numerous projects and initiatives and making provision for implementing the APEC Putrajaya Vision 2040, including through this Aotearoa Plan of Action, in their terms of reference, work plans and strategic plans. Some of the notable outcomes this year included:

- Six Ministerial Meetings in SCE workstream areas:
 - The EGILAT supported Thailand in its hosting of the 5th APEC Meeting of Ministers Responsible for Forestry (MMRF);
 - The Health Working Group (HWG) contributed to the 12th High-Level Meeting on Health and the Economy (HLMHE);
 - o The ATCWG and the Ocean and Fisheries Working Group (OFWG) supported Thailand in its hosting of the 7th APEC Ministerial Meeting on Food Security where APEC Ministers endorsed the Implementation Plan for the Food Security Roadmap 2030;
 - The Tourism Working Group (TWG) supported Thailand in its hosting of the 11th Tourism Ministerial Meeting where Ministers endorsed an update to the Guidelines on Tourism Stakeholders as well as a set of Policy Recommendations for Tourism of the Future on Regenerative Tourism;
 - o The Policy Partnership on Women and the Economy (PPWE) supported Thailand in its hosting of the annual Women and the Economy Forum; and

- The Small and Medium Enterprises Working Group (SMEWG) contributed to the 28th APEC SME Ministerial Meeting (SMEMM) held in September;
- The Emergency Preparedness Working Group (EPWG) hosted the 15th Senior Disaster Management Officials Forum (SDMOF);
- The APEC Information Portal for Safe Passage Across the Region was launched with contributions from the Health Working Group;
- The Agricultural Technical Cooperation Working Group (ATCWG) contributed to the development and endorsement of the Implementation Plan of the Food Security Roadmap 2030, as well as aligned its projects and workplans with the Roadmap's Key Action Areas;
- The Anti-Corruption and Transparency Working Group (ACTWG) endorsed the 'Compilation of APEC Members' Anti-Corruption Prevention and Transparency Measures related to the Covid-19 Outbreaks: Policy, Good Practices and Measures;'
- The SMEWG conducted a stock take of projects and initiatives that contribute to the 'APEC Strategy on Green, Sustainable and Innovative MSMEs' for the period 2018-2022 and endorsed for publication Thailand's 'Handbook on Enhancing Green MSMEs' Competitiveness for a Sustainable and Inclusive Asia-Pacific Phase II Food Sector Waste Reduction in Food Supply Chain;'
- The Transportation Working Group (TPTWG) held policy discussions on how the APEC region could decarbonize transport under the Land Expert Group;
- The Policy Partnership on Science, Technology and Innovation (PPSTI) published a technological toolkit titled 'Industry 4.0: Enabling Technologies and Inclusive Digitization for Post-COVID-19 Economic Recovery in APEC Value Chains' and launched the APEC Young Scientist Training Program, The Inclusive Science Leadership Program for Early to Mid-Career Researchers in APEC 2022 and the development of Women in STEM Metrics Framework;
- The Policy Partnership on Women and the Economy (PPWE) held numerous public-private policy dialogues and workshops on women's empowerment, opportunities and challenges through the BCG model as well as women's full participation of COVID-19 economic recovery. In addition, the PPWE held the annual APEC BEST Award;
- The Human Resource Development Working Group (HRDWG) supported Thailand as host of a panel discussion on Shaping Smart Citizens with Digitalization and Eco-friendly Awareness;
- The Energy Working Group (EWG) revised the APEC Energy Security Initiative (ESI) to reflect a broader understanding of energy security in a time of energy transition; and
- The Telecommunications Working Group advanced work on the *Initiative on Global Challenge and Cooperation Utilizing ICT COVID-19 pandemic and beyond*'.

The annual report details activities in areas such as energy, fisheries, food security, transportation, SMEs and tourism. A discussion of the above and other highlights and priorities, including the financial contributions of APEC economies to the APEC Support Fund's various sub-funds are set out in **Section 2**.

Section 3 provides an overview of all sub-fora governance documents. Each forum also reports on projects, both funded by APEC and self-funded by economies, undertaken in 2022 through Fora in Action tables. The tables include a listing of all projects current in implementation phase as well as concept notes that have received in-principle BMC approval during project sessions one and two.

Finally, the following recommendations are outlined in **Section 4** for consideration during the 2022 APEC Ministerial Meeting (AMM):

- 1. Note the 2022 Senior Officials' Report on Economic and Technical Cooperation;
- 2. Welcome the achievements of the SCE Working Groups and Policy Partnerships;
- 3. Welcome the revised ECOTECH Medium Term Priorities, now aligned with the objectives of the Putrajaya Vision 2040 and the Aotearoa Plan of Action;
- 4. Welcome the establishment of the APEC Bio-Circular-Green (BCG) Award; and
- 5. Welcome the 2022 contributions to the various sub-funds of the APEC Support Funds from five economies: China; Japan; Korea; Chinese Taipei and the United States.

1. Introduction

The member economies of the Asia Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) forum progressed in a range of areas of economic and technical cooperation, with the Senior Officials' Meeting (SOM) Steering Committee on Economic and Technical Cooperation (SCE) and SCE sub-fora providing contributions in training, skills development and information sharing.

A year in review: In 2022, the SCE was chaired by Mr. Matt Murray, APEC Senior Official for the United States, with Mr. Pruthipong Poonthrigobol of Thailand serving as SCE Vice Chair. The Committee met on three occasions and accomplished the following:

- Updated the ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities to align them with the Putrajaya Vision 2040 and the Aotearoa Plan of Action;
- Discussed ECOTECH policy initiatives including two events exploring the Bio-Circular-Green (BCG) Economy Model;
- Published three reports, including the final project report on 'Understanding the Bio-Circular-Green (BCG) Economy Model for Strong, Balanced, Secure, Sustainable and Inclusive Growth in the Asia-Pacific;' the final project report on Initiative for Realizing Sustainable Cities Focusing on Improvement of Resource Circulation and Waste Management'; and the final project report on 'Partnership towards Sustainable Economic Growth through the BCG;'
- Endorsed the annual 'APEC Bio-Circular-Green (BCG) Award' project proposal;
- Coordinated the work of SCE sub-fora to facilitate recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic and to ensure alignment with the APEC Putrajaya Vision 2040 (APV2040) and the Aotearoa Plan of Action (APA); and
- Provided direction to SCE sub-fora on Work Plans, Strategic Plans, and Terms of Reference.

The first SCE meeting of the year was held virtually on 23 February at which time the SCE launched the Medium-Term ECOTECH Review, focusing its efforts on better aligning medium-term ECOTECH priorities with the APV2040 and its implementation plan, the APA. The SCE discussed the 2022 SCE Work Plan and agreed to continue discussions intersessionally (2022/SOM3/SCE/IS07).

The annual SCE Committee of the Whole (SCE-COW) was held virtually on 20 February with attendance from all 21 APEC member economies and 14 SCE sub-fora conveners or their representatives. The SCE endorsed the work plans of seven SCE sub-fora: The Agricultural Technical Cooperation Working Group (ATCWG); the Human Resources Development Working Group (HRDWG); the Oceans and Fisheries Working Group (OFWG); the Policy Partnership on Science, Technology and Innovation (PPSTI); the Small and Medium Enterprises Working Group (SMEWG); the Telecommunications and Information Working Group (TELWG); and the Transportation Working Group (TPTWG) (2022/SOM1/019).

Further, on 22 February 2022 the SCE oversaw Thailand's self-funded project event on 'Understanding the Bio-Circular-Green (BCG) Economy Model for Strong, Balanced, Secure, Sustainable and Inclusive Growth in the Asia-Pacific.' The policy dialogue and subsequent APEC publication of the same name sought to outline how APEC economies can achieve sustainable economic growth objectives by synergizing the three approaches of the BCG Economy Model and exploring potential partnerships across government, the private sector and academia.

Intersessionally, the SCE endorsed the 2022 work plan for the Emergency Preparedness Working Group (EPWG) and the 2021-2025 Strategic Plan for the ATCWG.

The second SCE meeting was held on 17 May in Bangkok with members participating both in-person and virtually. The SCE approved Thailand's self-funded project on 'Partnership towards Sustainable Economic Growth through the Bio-Circular-Green Economy Model,' and continued discussions initiated during SCE 1 covering matters such as the SCE's implementation of the APV2040 and the APA, as supported through the

ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities Review exercise, advancing the review and renewal section of the APA and identifying areas for further discussion with respect to the 2022 SCE annual work plan.

Intersessionally, the SCE endorsed the 2022 work plans of: The Health Working Group (HWG); the Policy Partnership for Women and the Economy (PPWE); the Anti-Corruption and Transparency Experts' Working Group (ACTWG); the Tourism Working Group (TWG); and the Experts Group on Illegal Logging and Associated Trade (EGILAT). Further, the APEC Executive Director amalgamated two distinct reports into one comprehensive document that details how SCE sub-fora work plans address APEC's overall vision and objective's and identifies and recommends gaps in the ECOTECH agenda requiring SCE direction or attention (see: Annex 1). In July 2022 the SCE oversaw the project event for Japan's self-funded project: 'Initiative for Realizing Sustainable Cities Focusing on Improvement of Resource Circulation and Waste Management.'

On 27 August, the SCE oversaw a project event for Thailand's self-funded project: 'Partnership towards Sustainable Economic Growth through the Bio-Circular-Green Economy Model.' At this roundtable, policymakers heard from private and financial sector representatives on what drives and incentivizes businesses to adopt sustainable practices. Delegates also deliberated over policy levers to further expand access to sustainable financing and investment given their crucial role to encourage and empower small businesses to pivot towards more environmentally friendly and sustainable approaches.

On 28 August 2022, Thailand hosted SCE 3 in-person in Chiang Mai with all twenty-one APEC economies as well as ABAC and PECC representatives present, either in-person or virtually. The SCE noted updates on the OFWG-led Roadmap on Small-Scale Fisheries and Aquaculture; the Roadmap on Marine Debris; and the Roadmap on Combatting Illegal, Unreported and Unregulated Fishing as well as the update to the EWG-led Energy Security Initiative. Discussions on advancing the Review and Renewal Section of the Aotearoa Plan of Action, included presentations by China on the 'Implementation of Collective Actions of ECOTECH related Agenda and Priorities in the APEC Putrajaya Vision 2040 including through Aotearoa Plan of Action' (2022/SOM3/SCE/007) and updates by New Zealand on its Individual Actions under the APA (2022/SOM3/SCE/008). At SCE3 the SCE noted general agreement on the 2022 SCE workplan, despite an inability to achieve consensus on the final version due to the concerns of one economy. The SCE Chair welcomed members' thoughts on how we can ensure that the SCE is a constructive space where economic and technical cooperation aims are advanced. Further, the SCE advanced discussions on the ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities Review (2022/SOM3/SCE/010), considered future work to review and revise the SCE Terms of Reference and next steps in the SCE's Standardized Fora Assessment Program (2022/SOM3/SCE/012)

Intersessionally, the SCE approved for publication the final project report: 'Partnership towards Sustainable Economic Growth through the BCG Economy Model' and the final project report: 'Initiative for Realizing Sustainable Cities Focusing on Improvement of Resource Circulation and Waste Management.' In addition, the SCE endorsed the update to the ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities, Thailand's project proposal for the annual APEC BCG Award and strategic plans for the Experts Group on Illegal Logging and Associated Trade (EGILAT); the Policy Partnerships on Science, Technology and Innovation (PPSTI) and the Transportation Working Group (TPTWG).

2. 2022 Highlights and Priorities

2.1 Host Economy Priorities

Sustainability powers economic growth. During the year, the SCE and its sub-fora furthered 2022 priorities, particularly in the area of 'Balance in all aspects.' This included supporting the introduction and roll out of a post-pandemic growth strategy called the Bio-Circular-Green (BCG) Economy Model. Thailand, as the host of APEC 2022 introduced the BCG Economy Model, which aims to comprehensively address environmental challenges, including climate change, extreme weather and natural disasters. At its core the BCG Economy Model combines science, innovation and technology to promote the efficient use of resources, to maintain and restore ecosystems and to reduce waste in a bid to build a system where economies and businesses can thrive.

During 2022, the SCE oversaw the implementation of Thailand's self-funded project event on 'Understanding the Bio-Circular-Green (BCG) Economy Model for Strong, Balanced, Secure, Sustainable and Inclusive Growth in the Asia-Pacific.' This project sought to enhance economies' knowledge and understanding of the BCG Economy Model and explored its potential application in APEC's work. The project included a Policy Dialogue held on the margins of SCE1 to discuss the BCG Economy within the context of: (1) agriculture and food systems; (2) energy efficiency and resilience; and (3) waste management and creativity in the economy. A study of APEC economies' experiences, and knowledge gaps on the application of the BCG Economy Model or similar approaches was completed in July. The SCE published the outcome report for this event in August.

A Japanese-led, APEC funded project event held in 2022 for project SCE01 2019: *Initiative for Realising Sustainable Cities Focusing on Improvement of Resource Circulation and Waste Management*, provided municipal authorities with training on the application of a toolkit for identifying weaknesses and affecting improvements to waste management services and infrastructure. This approach embraces aspects of circularity, namely reusing and recycling existing materials and products - a core tenet of the BCG Economy Model.

The SCE further supported a roundtable event through Thailand's self-funded project: 'Partnership towards Sustainable Economic Growth through the Bio-Circular-Green Economy Model,' which built on the outcomes Thailand's aforementioned project. The roundtable focused on fostering public-private-people partnerships to enhance sustainable economic growth approaches, including the BCG Economy Model. At the dialogue, policymakers heard from private and financial sector representatives on what drives and incentivizes businesses to adopt sustainable practices. The discussion tackled the fault lines laid bare by COVID-19 and the resulting economic impacts in the APEC region. Delegates also deliberated over policy levers to further expand access to sustainable financing and investment given their crucial role to encourage and empower small businesses.

Further, the SCE discussed China's proposals: "APEC Guidelines on Smart Cities Development to Promote Inclusive and Sustainable Growth in Asia-Pacific," and "Promoting Green and Low-carbon Transition for Inclusive and Sustainable Growth in Asia-Pacific." The SCE did not reach consensus on either project proposal. Some economies supported the proposals, while other economies recommended that the proposals be considered at the working group-level to enable subject matter experts to evaluate the merits of both and to incorporate comments and feedback from economies.

Sustainability lies in the way economies manage its resources. The Agricultural Technical Cooperation Working Group (ATCWG) supported Thailand as host of the annual APEC Food Security Ministerial Meeting in August. APEC Ministers discussed water, soil, plant and farm management strategies, including market driven production approaches to combat food insecurity. Ministers also endorsed an Implementation Plan of Food Security Roadmap Towards 2030 to navigate and coordinate actions, projects and activities to achieve food security in the region. The ATCWG, in coordination with the Policy Partnership on Food Security (PPFS), led the development of the implementation plan, which focuses on assisting economies transition towards sustainable food systems and agricultural practices. The ATCWG also endorsed the project proposal "Promote

Rural Development and Prosperity for All Our People in APEC region" which aims to facilitate agricultural and rural development for all people in our region.

In addition, with the assistance of the Experts' Group on Illegal Logging and Associated Trade (EGILAT), Thailand convened a Meeting of Ministers Responsible for Forestry in August to promote sustainable forest management and rehabilitation, including trade facilitation for legally harvested forest products and the development of a forest timber and products certification. Further, EGILAT members endorsed the EGILAT Policy Theme 2 (2022-2023): 'Advancing the trade and distribution of legally harvested forest products: Navigating to legal timber,' which includes improving the Compendium of Resources for the Facilitation of the Trade and Distribution of Legally Harvested Forest products in the APEC Region, published in 2021 as part of Policy Theme 1.

The Oceans and Fisheries Working Group (OFWG) focused its efforts in 2022 on protecting the health of marine environments and resources, including strengthening efforts and utilizing data and research to address the problem of marine debris, including plastic litter. In addition, the OFWG reported to the SCE on its actions and progress towards achieving the goals outlined in the Combatting Illegal, Unreported and Unregulated Fishing and Marine Debris Roadmaps. Further, OFWG promoted sustainable, local and artisanal fisheries, with the introduction of a roadmap that seeks to provide targeted support to the small-scale fisheries and aquaculture industry.

At the 12th High-Level Meeting on Health and the Economy, APEC member economies actively participated in discussions on the interconnection between the economy and the health challenges in the Asia-Pacific region and on how APEC could better balance health and the economy, with the Chair's Statement emphasizing the importance balancing health and the economy and global health security.

Sustainability starts with how the region fuels its growth. In 2022 the themes of energy security, clean energy development and deployment, energy efficiency, energy resilience, energy access and sustainable growth continued to be prominent in the Energy Working Group's (EWG) activities. The EWG's major accomplishment in 2022 was the endorsement of the revised APEC Energy Security Initiative (ESI) in April 2022. EWG members agreed at EWG 58 in 2019 to revise the ESI, first endorsed in 2001 at EWG22, to reflect a broader understanding of energy security in a time of energy transition. The 2022 ESI provides a framework for the EWG to undertake activities that support the energy security goals of APEC member economies to provide access to affordable, reliable, resilient, modern and sustainable energy.

Further, the Transportation Working Group (TPTWG) held policy discussions on how the APEC region could decarbonize transport under the Land Expert Group. The agenda had a strong sustainability focus with discussions and recommendations centering on subsidies, support for charging infrastructure, and mandates for manufacturers to produce cleaner vehicles. This advice was echoed by the APEC PSU with its Policy Brief: 'Policy Options for Decarbonizing Transportation in APEC'.

Sustainability drives innovation. In 2022 the Small and Medium Enterprises Working Group (SMEWG) worked with Thailand as host of a gathering of ministers to exchange views on best policy practices in support of small business. Ministers discussed ways to drive MSME growth, including the acceleration of the adoption of the bio-circular-green economy model. Further, a seminar was held in September to share practices to encourage MSMEs to innovate for sustainable, inclusive development. SMEWG also conducted "2022 APEC SME Seminar on Promoting 'Specialized and innovative' Development" to enhance economies' level of specialization and innovation whilst encouraging MSMEs to follow green strategies which leads to inclusive development. Under Thailand's leadership, the SMEWG also undertook a stocktaking and review of APEC projects that promote green, sustainable and innovative MSMEs from 2018-2022 and the SMEWG endorsed for publication Thailand's 'Handbook on Enhancing Green MSMEs' Competitiveness for a Sustainable and Inclusive Asia-Pacific Phase II – Food Sector Waste Reduction in Food Supply Chain'.

The Policy Partnership on Science, Technology and Innovation (PPSTI) published a technological toolkit titled 'Industry 4.0: Enabling Technologies and Inclusive Digitization for Post-COVID-19 Economic Recovery in APEC Value Chains.' The Toolkit contains industry 4.0 solutions to support developing economies affected by the COVID-19 pandemic to increase their technical and commercial capabilities. A policy dialogue on Green Synergy Solutions for Sustainable Community on Agriculture Residue-Based Energy and Circular Economy was held in September to discuss ways to promote an eco-community by using abundant bio-wastes to produce green hydrogen/methane and bio-fertilizer by synergetic bio-refinery processes for circular economies in the APEC region. Further, several initiatives were undertaken to encourage participation of youth and women in science, technology and innovation. This included the APEC Young Scientist Training Program, The Inclusive Science Leadership Program for Early to Mid-Career Researchers in APEC 2022, the development of Women in STEM Metrics Framework. PPSTI also endorsed the project "The Innovating for Public Urban Technology Transformation (INPUT2) Competition" which aims to facilitate adopt new and emerging technologies, encourage public urban technology transformation. Further, Women in STEM Research Fellowships were delivered by the HRDWG to encourage mobility of post-doctorate women researchers in APEC.

TWG supported Thailand as host of the Tourism Ministers' Meeting in August, where Ministers discussed policies and to revive the tourism and travel industry in the region so that it is safe, sustainable, responsible and more inclusive. Ministers considered a series of policy recommendations to ensure that the benefits of tourism are distributed fairly among local communities. Ministers endorsed the Tourism Working Group's (TWG) APEC Updated Guidelines on Tourism Stakeholders and the TWG Policy Recommendations for Tourism of the Future: Regenerative Tourism.

The Emergency Preparedness Working Group (EPWG) hosted the 15th Senior Disaster Management Officials Forum (SDMOF) during which members shared their best practices and local perspectives on how to mainstream disaster risk reduction policies and promote public-private partnership by leveraging digital innovation and multi-hazard approach so as to build emergency response capacity and business resilience. The EPWG also took the decision to update the 2015 Disaster Risk Reduction Framework (DRRF) and the 2016 Disaster Risk Reduction Action Plan (DRRAP) in 2023. Both the 2015 DRRF and 2016 DRRAP were endorsed by APEC leaders but require a refresh due to the lack of post Covid-19 context and sustainability perspective.

Sustainability succeeds when diversity and inclusion are at its core. In June 2022, PPWE held a policy dialogue to discuss women empowerment, through the BCG model towards balanced, inclusive, and sustainable growth. In their break-out session discussions, policy makers, experts and business leaders shared their views and experiences on how to meaningfully engage women in sustainable economic growth strategies. In August and in September, PPWE and the Women's Economic Forum held policy dialogues on how models such as the BCG Economy can advance women's economic empowerment and build resilience for future shocks to APEC economies. At the 47th Human Resource Development Working Group (HRDWG) plenary Thailand hosted a panel discussion on Shaping Smart Citizens with Digitalization and Eco-friendly Awareness with participants from member economies, universities, and international organizations. On November 3, the 7th APEC BEST Award was conducted with the new nominations introduced (BCG Economy leader and BEST Top manager in BCG economy).

Further, the TELWG undertook activities that advanced the 'Smart Silver Innovation Project.' Since 2019 this project has sponsored additional lectures, workshops, and reports on aging societies aiming to find appropriate digital solutions to solve the issues on ageing society by ICT. To further support APEC's inclusive growth agenda, the SMEWG continued to support the internationalisation of Indigenous businesses. The TELWG also conducted a workshop on 'Driving the Digital Transformation and Capacity Building for APEC Indigenous Peoples through i-Tribe Free Outdoor WiFi', which focused on inclusive connectivity.

2.2 ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities

The ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities, are a set of key programming areas originally developed to focus members collective efforts on meeting the commitments outlined in the Economic and Technical Cooperation

Section (Part II) of APEC's framework for achieving the Bogor Goals - the Osaka Action Agenda. With APEC having established a new vision statement in 2020 - the Putrajaya Vision 2040 (APV2040) and subsequently an implementation plan to achieve its objectives in 2021 -the Aotearoa Plan of Action (APA), a need was identified to ensure that the ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities were fit for purpose and aligned with APEC's new agenda. Due for review in 2019, SCE took the decision to delay the review until 2022 to ensure that the Medium-Term priorities were aligned with the implementation plan for the APV2040 (2019/SOM1/019).

The 1996 Manila Declaration on an Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation Framework for Strengthening Economic Cooperation and Development outlined the key areas of APEC economic and technical cooperation. A revised set of priorities were established in 2010 and further refined in 2014 (2014/SOM3/SCE/002) that covered the following cross-cutting and work stream priorities:

<u>Cross-cutting priorities</u>: 1. Developing human capital through capacity building; 2. Developing and strengthening the dynamism of SMEs; 3. Harnessing technologies for the future and supporting innovation; 4. Inclusive growth - addressing the social dimension of globalization, health, gender.

<u>Workstream priorities</u>: 5. Regional economic integration; 6. Structural reform; 7. Safeguarding the quality of life through sustainable growth; 8. Human security.

Through the 2022 review process, members affirmed that the previous ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities align and are captured within the APV2040 and APA's economic drivers, objectives and collective actions. The mapping first identified and then integrated relevant collective actions into the ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities framework for the SCE's next five-year cycle. Table 1 showcases the alignment between the previous ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities and the ECOTECH-related Collective Actions outlined in the APA. In addition, table 1 identifies SCE sub-fora that play a leadership role in the advancement of the ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities.

As of 2023, SCE and its sub-fora will be expected to reflect the updated ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities (the ECOTECH-related collective actions) in their work plans as well as in their end year reporting, while using existing templates and reporting structures.

2.3 Fora Administration

a. Ensuring alignment of SCE Fora Governance Documents

In accordance with the SCE Terms of Reference, the SCE has the mandate to "coordinate action-oriented and integrated strategies in accordance with Leaders' and Ministers' commitments." In 2022, the SCE discussed how to ensure that all SCE sub-fora made adequate provision to implement the APEC Putrajaya Vision 2040, including through the Aotearoa Plan of Action, in their work plans, strategic plans and terms of reference. As a result, SCE sub-fora, with the assistance of the SCE, undertook a review of their governance documents and the table below references whether the work plans, terms of reference and strategic plans of SCE sub fora are reflective of APEC's overarching vision and objectives – the Putrajaya Vision 2040, including, when relevant, the Aotearoa Plan of Action.

b. Approving Strategic Plans

As of 2 November, 2022, the SCE approved 5 Strategic Plans: Agricultural Technical Cooperation Working Group (ATCWG); Experts Group on Illegal Logging and Associated Trade (EGILAT); Human Resources Development Working Group (HRDWG); Policy Partnerships on Science, Technology and Innovation (PPSTI), Transportation Working Group (TPTWG). Work remains ongoing at the sub-fora level with a view towards having all expired or expiring strategic plans updated before the end of the 2022 calendar year.

c. Approving Annual Work Plans

The Terms of Reference of SCE, as reconfirmed in 2020, mandates SCE to "assess and direct realignment of individual work plans of Working Groups and SOM Policy Partnerships with the APEC-wide medium-term ECOTECH priorities and annual objectives as outlined in the ECOTECH framework" and stipulates that "to this purpose, all Working Groups and Policy Partnerships should submit their strategic and annual work plans to the SCE." As such, 14 work plans were submitted and all were approved in 2022 (as reflected in Table 2).

In addition, the Executive Director of the APEC Secretariat presented a report: '2022 Report of the APEC Secretariat Executive Director on Fora Work: Alignment, Synergies, and Implementation of the Putrajaya Vision 2040 including through the Aotearoa Plan of Action' (annex 1), which noted that the majority of SCE sub-fora focused their activities to respond to recent mandates from Leaders and Ministers with sub fora such as EPWG; HRDWG; PPSTI; PPWE; SMEWG; and TPTWG specifically citing recent the instructions from Ministers. In addition, the majority of sub-fora made linkages between their specific activities and APEC 2022 priorities.

2.4 Alignment of SCE fora Work with ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities

Notably, all SCE sub-fora work plans make linkages between their specific activities and the relevant ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities. Further SCE sub-fora end year reports highlighted the work completed that meaningfully advanced APEC's efforts to achieve its medium-term objectives. Table 3 provides examples of 2022 SCE fora deliverables contributing to the achievement of the ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities.

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2.5 Response to COVID-19

In 2022 SCE sub-fora contributed to programs that will help economies increase sustainable economic growth and support the recovery of small and medium sized enterprises from the impacts of COVID-19 within the region. The following are examples of 2022 workshops and other events in support of post-pandemic recovery:

- Compilation of APEC Members' Anti-Corruption Prevention and Transparency Measures related to the Covid-19 Outbreaks: Policy, Good Practices and Measures;
- Post COVID-19 Reaction: APEC SEN Distance Learning Platform for Seafarers Conference;
- Contributions to the Sub-Fund on APEC Cooperation on Combatting COVID-19 and Economic Recovery Workshop on Developing APEC Cities and Built Environments;
- Strategy: Build Back Better Post Covid-19 Pandemic;
- Strengthening Emergency Medical Services (EMS) System for Safe and Resilient Responses in Disease Outbreaks;
- Risk-smart Business in the Post COVID-19 Industry 4.0: Enabling Technologies and Inclusive Digitization for Post-COVID-19 Economic Recovery in APEC Value Chains;
- Going Digital to Build Resilience and Sustainable Growth in Response to COVID-19; and
- Opening Seminar of Tourism Industry of Asia-Pacific Region in the COVID-19 Recovery Period: Current Situation, Trends and Challenges.

2.6 Cross-Fora Collaboration

The annual meeting of SCE Fora Chairs and Lead Shepherds (SCE-Committee of the Whole) held on 20 February 2022 in a virtual format. Chairs and Lead Shepherds or their representatives from all 14 of the SCE for aparticipated. The presence of Chairs, Lead Shepherds or their representatives increased their interactions with each other and Senior Officials, leading to useful practical suggestions for collaborating with other APEC fora. At SCE 2 2022, the APEC Secretariat introduced an amalgamated report that included an assessment of the cross-fora collaborations in annual fora work plans: '2022 Report of the APEC Secretariat Executive Director on Fora Work: Alignment, Synergies, and Implementation of the Putrajaya Vision 2040 including through the Aotearoa Plan of Action (annex 1)'. In 2022, SCE sub-fora identified over 100 areas of potential cross-fora collaboration. Further, collaboration was not confined to the same or the more obvious partners but rather a diverse range of partners, differing from project to project. For example, recognizing that the work of the TPTWG is relevant to the Auto Dialogue and Energy Working Group, members of these groups were invited to participate in the relevant energy-transport workshops and meetings including a joint session between the AD and TPTWG in Bangkok in September. Further, in 2022 the TELWG and DESG discussed the mechanisms for better implementation of the APEC Internet and Digital Internet Economy Roadmap (AIDER) in Digital Economy Steering Group (DESG), including the TELWG joint meeting and Private-Public Dialogue and planned to organize a DESG-TELWG joint meeting and Private-Public Dialogue. The most active sub-fora in terms of collaboration is TWG with EPWG, HRDWG, PPWE, and SMEWG with the TELWG self-reporting the fewest internal and external collaborations in 2022.

The OFWG reported extensive collaborative efforts with APEC fora as well as with relevant regional and international fisheries bodies, to exchange experiences and best practices, as well as to benefit from their work. This included identifying cross-cutting themes for cooperative work and partnerships, with the Policy Partnership on Food Security (PPFS) and Sub-Committee on Customs Procedures (SCCP), and PPWE on gender equality in the fisheries and aquaculture sectors.

The ATCWG collaborated with the PPFS on the Workshop entitled Sharing Good Practices on Sustainable Agricultural Development through the Principle of Sufficiency Economy. Further, the ATCWG continued to support the implementation of the La Serena Roadmap for Women and Inclusive Growth by adhering to its guidelines in conducting its activities, particularly in "Empowering women through access to capital and

markets", "Support women's education, training and skills development and access in a changing world of work" and "Advancing women's economic empowerment through data collection and analysis".

A number of SCE sub-fora identified collaboration with external partners in their events or activities as per the principles and procedures for managing cooperation between APEC and non-member entities and individuals. For example, within the HWG, representatives from other international organisation, nongovernmental organisation, and academia, including World Health Organization (WHO), ASEAN, the United Nations' Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific (ESCAP), the EcoHealth Alliance, the University of Melbourne, and the private sector, actively participated in meetings and the 12th APEC High-Level Meeting on Health and the Economy. Further, the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) and the World Trade Organisation (WTO) briefed the OFWG on the FAO Voluntary Guidelines for Transshipment and the Agreement on Fisheries Subsidies, adopted at the 12th Ministerial Conference (MC12) respectively.

While five SCE sub-fora work plans explicitly identified potential collaborations with ABAC, few concrete engagements were highlighted in SCE sub-fora end year reporting. There is therefore likely scope for more frequent collaboration with ABAC as well as ASEAN and the Pacific Islands Forum Secretariat, given their respective roles within the broader APEC process.

2.7 APEC Support Fund

In 2004, Ministers endorsed the Australian proposal to set up the APEC Support Fund (ASF) to serve as a flexible funding mechanism. The ASF aims to meet the capacity building needs for developing economy members in APEC's agreed high priority sectors for economic and technical cooperation. Since its inception, the fund has received contributions from many economies.

Voluntary contributions by APEC members to the ASF and its sub-funds in 2022 (as of 10 November, 2022) were provided or committed by five economies: China; Japan; Korea; and Chinese Taipei.

China provided USD 1,000,000 to the ASF Sub-Fund on APEC Cooperation on Combatting COVID-19 and Economic Recovery, and USD 520,000 to the ASF Sub-Fund on Connectivity.

Japan provided USD 765,685 to the ASF Sub-Fund on Energy Efficiency, Low Carbon and Energy Resiliency Measures.

Korea provided USD 700,000 to the ASF Sub-Fund on Digital Innovation.

Chinese Taipei provided USD 500,000 to the ASF General Fund, USD 500,000 to the ASF Digital Innovation Sub Fund, USD 500,000 to the ASF Marine Debris Management and Innovation Sub Fund, and USD 500,000 to the ASF Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises Sub Fund.

United States provided USD 250,000 to the ASF Marine Debris Management and Innovation Sub Fund.

3. SCE Fora in Action

The work of SCE is evident in the number and scope of its 14 for and the projects overseen by those for a.

In 2022 the approval rate for all APEC Concept Notes applying to the ASF sub-funds was 100% across both Project Sessions, compared with 89% in 2021. The overall approval rate for GPA, TILF and ASF General Fund similarly increased from 72% to 85%, in 2022. The high approval rates are the result of a significant decrease in the number of Concept Notes applying for funding since 2020, and an increase in the funding available for projects, particularly an increase in the number of ASF sub-funds since 2019. These two factors reduced competition amongst Concept Notes for funding and has implications for the quality of APEC capacity building projects.

4. Recommendations

The following recommendations are proposed to the 2022 APEC Ministerial Meeting (AMM):

- 1. Note the 2022 Senior Officials' Report on Economic and Technical Cooperation;
- 2. Welcome the achievements of the SCE Working Groups and Policy Partnerships;
- 3. Welcome the revised ECOTECH Medium Term Priorities, now aligned with the objectives of the Putrajaya Vision 2040 and the Aotearoa Plan of Action;
- 4. Welcome the establishment of the APEC BCG Award; and
- 5. Welcome the 2022 contributions to the various sub-funds of the APEC Support Funds from five economies: China; Japan; Korea; Chinese Taipei and the United States.

Report of the APEC Secretariat Executive Director on Fora Work: Alignment, Synergies, and Implementation of the Putrajaya Vision 2040 including through the Aotearoa Plan of Action

- 1. In line with the recommendations for *Strengthening Economic and Technical Cooperation in APEC* issued in 2010, the APEC Secretariat Executive Director provides an annual report on how SCE sub-fora work plans address APEC's overall vision and objectives.
- 2. The SCE sub-fora annual work plans are tabled at the annual SCE-Committee of the Whole Meeting (SCE-COW) seeking approval in accordance with the recommendations of the 2010 ECOTECH Report.
- 3. The SCE has also tasked "the Secretariat to undertake a strategic assessment of synergies within the ECOTECH agenda after SOM1 and provide recommendations to SCE2 about gaps that may require SCE attention or direction" (point 7 of SCE Report on Improving ECOTECH in APEC (2013/SOM3/030)).
- 4. The first report by the APEC Secretariat (2014/SOM2/SCE/004) was submitted to the SCE2 in 2014. The second report was presented to the SCE2 in 2015.
- 5. In 2020, Leaders agreed to the Putrajaya Vision 2040, charting APEC's course for the next 20 years. In implementing the Putrajaya Vision 2040 including through the Aotearoa Action Plan, Leaders asked APEC for and sub-for to make provision for implementing the Putrajaya Vision 2040, including through the Aotearoa Action Plan, in their terms of reference, work plans and strategic plans.
- 6. In an effort to avoid duplication, the APEC Executive Director now attempts to rationalize these reports and add in the status of implementation of the Putrajaya Vision 2040 including through the Aotearoa Plan of Action in annual work plans.
- 7. With the SCE's approval this combined annual report will examine how SCE sub-fora work plans address APEC's overall vision and objective's, provide recommendations on any gaps in the ECOTECH agenda that may require SCE direction or attention, and provide information on the status of implementation of the Putrajaya Vision including through the Aotearoa Plan of Action in SCE sub-fora work plans.

Status of SCE Sub-fora Work Plan Submission

8. The SCE Terms of Reference stipulate that Working Groups and Policy Partnerships should submit their annual work plans three weeks prior to the annual SCE-COW on the margins of SCE1. The APEC Secretariat analyzed thirteen sub-fora work plans: Anti-Corruption and Transparency Working Group; Agricultural Technical Cooperation Working Group; Experts Group on Illegal Logging and Associated Trade; Emergency Preparedness Working Group; Health Working Group; Human Resources Development Working Group; Oceans and Fisheries Working Group; Policy Partnership for Science, Technology, and Innovation; Policy Partnership for Women and the Economy; Small and Medium Enterprises Working Group; Telecommunications and Information Working Group; Tourism Working Group; and Transportation Working Group as of 10 March 2022.

Alignment of Work Plans with Broader APEC Objectives

- 9. The majority of SCE sub-fora focused their activities to respond to recent mandates from Leaders and Ministers. 15 16 17
- 10. A majority of sub-fora made linkages between their specific activities and APEC 2022 priorities. 18
- 11. All work plans also make linkages between their specific activities and the relevant ECOTECH Medium Term Priorities, which is facilitated by the template.

Synergies

- 12. The strategic assessment of work plans developed the following conclusions:
 - SCE sub-fora identified over 100 areas of potential cross-fora collaboration.
 - Potential collaboration is being identified with other SCE sub-fora as well as with the Economic Committee, the Committee on Trade and Investment along with their sub-fora, as well as the Finance Ministers Process/Senior Finance Officials' Meeting.
 - Collaboration is not confined to the same or the more obvious partners but rather is diverse, and often differs from project to project.
 - The most active sub-fora in terms of collaboration is TWG with EPWG, HRDWG, PPWE, and SMEWG also seeking to collaborate with a number of APEC sub-fora. The sub-fora with the fewest self-reported collaborations is TELWG.
 - A number of SCE sub-fora identified collaboration with external partners in their events or activities
 as per the principles and procedures for managing cooperation between APEC and non-member
 entities and individuals.¹⁹

Gaps

13. While five work plans explicitly identified potential collaborations with ABAC. There likely is scope for more frequent collaboration with ABAC as well as ASEAN and the Pacific Islands Forum Secretariat, given their respective roles within the broader APEC process.

Implementation of the Putrajaya Vision 2040 including through the Aotearoa Plan of Action

- 14. SCE sub-fora made provision to implement the APEC Putrajaya Vision 2040, including through the Aotearoa Plan of Action, in all their work plans and the majority of the terms of reference. Some SCE sub-fora updated their strategic plans by incorporating references to the implementation of the APEC Putrajaya Vision 2040, including through the Aotearoa Plan of Action.
- 15. Continued implementation of the Putrajaya Vision 2040 including through the Aotearoa Plan of Action in the SCE and its sub-fora may enhance synergies and cross-fora collaboration.

Aligning the ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities with the APEC Putrajaya Vision 2040

1. Introduction

The ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities focused members collective efforts on meeting the commitments outlined in the Economic and Technical Cooperation Section (Part II) of APEC's framework for achieving the Bogor Goals - the Osaka Action Agenda. During the 2014 review of the Manila Declaration, members agreed that the concepts of ECOTECH had broadened and it was time for a 'new cycle' that refreshed and updated existing priorities. Similarly, with APEC having adopted the Putrajaya Vision 2040 (APV2040) and subsequently an implementation plan to achieve its objectives in 2021 -the Aotearoa Plan of Action (APA), there is a need to revisit the ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities to ensure that they are fit for purpose and aligned with APEC's APV2040.

2. Background

Historically, the 1996 Manila Declaration on an Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation Framework for Strengthening Economic Cooperation and Development outlined the key areas of APEC economic and technical cooperation. In 2006, Ministers reaffirmed their commitment to the Manila Declaration, with a revised set of priorities established in 2010 and further refined in 2014 (2014/SOM3/SCE/002) that covered cross-cutting and work stream priorities:

Cross-cutting priorities

- 1. Developing human capital through capacity building
- 2. Developing and strengthening the dynamism of SMEs
- 3. Harnessing technologies for the future and supporting innovation
- 4. Inclusive growth addressing the social dimension of globalization, health, gender

Workstream priorities

- 5. Regional economic integration
- 6. Structural reform
- 7. Safeguarding the quality of life through sustainable growth
- 8. Human security

Due for review in 2019, SCE took the decision to delay to ensure that the Medium-Term priorities were aligned with the APV2040 including through its implementation plan, the APA (2019/SOM1/019, 2021/SOM1/SCE/SUM and 2021/SOM2/SCE/021).

In 2020, APEC Economic Leaders charted APEC's course for the next 20 years with the APV2040. Further, in 2021, APEC Economic Leaders agreed to implement the APV2040 including through the APA. The APA outlines the three economic drivers, alongside the objectives contained in the APV2040, while adding Medium-Term priorities or collective actions as the mechanism to facilitate the achievement of the longer-term goals of the APV2040 as well as the continuous improvement of APEC as an institution and review and renewal.

3. Approach

This approach fully subscribes to the original aims that guided the formulation of APEC's ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities and seeks to identify key areas of APEC economic and technical cooperation as outlined in the APV2040.

The SCE plays a lead role in supporting the achievement of APEC's vision including through the APA, and provides direction to SCE sub-fora on implementation matters. The collective actions are central to advancing APEC's ECOTECH agenda and APEC Leaders' ECOTECH-related priorities. The SCE

will continue to oversee, coordinate and provide policy guidance to the SCE sub-fora, while also contributing to the implementation of the ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities.

As evidenced by the mapping exercise below, the previous ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities align and are captured within the APV2040 and APA's economic drivers, objectives and collective actions. This exercise acknowledges the synchronicity between the APA's medium-term priorities or collective actions and the timelines and intention of the ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities. Thus, the mapping seeks to first align and then integrate relevant collective actions into the ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities framework for its next five-year cycle.

The below chart details the three economic drivers (column one), ECOTECH-related objectives (column two), and accompanying ECOTECH-related collective actions (column three) of the APA to implement the APV2040, mapped against key responsible SCE sub-fora spearheading specific areas of work on APEC's ECOTECH-related Collective Actions (column four) as well as the previous ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities (column five). Note that the below identification of key responsible sub-fora is not exhaustive, and other sub-fora may contribute to the achievement of the outcomes outlined in the APV2040 and the APA.

This exercise provides further guidance to SCE and its sub-fora as they implement the APV2040 including through the APA, and will center and focus ECOTECH-related workstreams around the specific collective actions most relevant to each SCE sub-fora. SCE sub-fora will be expected to reflect the updated ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities (the ECOTECH-related collective actions of the APA to implement the APV2040) in their work plans as well as in end year reporting, while using existing templates and reporting structures. When it comes time to renew Terms of Reference and Strategic Plans, SCE sub-fora will also be expected to carefully consider and incorporate ECOTECH-related Collective Actions in all governance document updates.

In addition, the SCE and its sub-fora are encouraged to work towards the achievement of ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities in a manner that is reflective of APEC's efforts to continuously improveAPEC as an institution, outlined in the Putrajaya Vision 2040 and the APA. These efforts could include deepening engagement with ABAC and the private sector, as well as PECC, PIF, ASEAN, and other international and regional organizations; promoting engagement with a broader range of economic stakeholders, such as NGOs and civil society, to reflect the breadth of the APEC Putrajaya Vision 2040; and continuously improving communications of APEC's work to the broader public.

4. Next Steps and Reporting

Originally, all APEC Committees and fora were requested to recognize the ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities in their work planning; however, in recent years only SCE and SCE sub-fora have reported on them annually. In addition, the SCE sub-fora are required to report on activities under each priority in their annual fora report (see generally 2014/AMM/015, Annual Work Plan and Fora Report Templates).

As of 2023 while SCE and its sub-fora continue implementing the Putrajaya Vision in a comprehensive and balanced manner in accordance with their mandate, and make provision for implementing the APV2040, including through the APA, in their terms of reference, work plans and strategic plans, SCE and its sub-fora will also draw from the ECOTECH-related APA Collective Actions or renewed ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities outlined in the mapping below to inform annual workplans. These collective actions will serve to update the previous ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities, which were incorporated into SCE sub-fora work plans. The key responsible SCE sub-fora,' are expected to reflect some or all of the ECOTECH Collective Actions identified in the mapping (now the ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities) in their work plans and end year reporting. However, all SCE sub-fora are welcome to self-identify and incorporate relevant ECOTECH-related Collective Actions in their governance and reporting documents.

SCE and its sub-fora will continue to report on progress in the implementation of the APV2040 and the achievement of the ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities through existing reporting templates, submitted on an annual basis, as per the standard reporting processes in place. This reporting will then be included in the <u>Senior Officials' Report on Economic and Technical Cooperation</u> tabled at the APEC Ministers' Meeting. SCE will review the ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities in 2027 with a view towards adjusting, as deemed necessary, and in full alignment with the priorities set out in the APV2040 and the APA.
