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Letter from the SCE Chair

It is with great pleasure that I present the 2020 APEC Senior Officials' Report on Economic and Technical Cooperation.

Like the rest of the world, the SCE and its sub-fora have had to make adjustments to 2020 plans. We managed to meet in February, but have unfortunately experienced the cancellation of all in-person plenary meetings and project events. The SCE and its sub-fora have still continued the important work of economic and technical cooperation. The SCE and its sub-fora quickly made the switch to virtual meetings which allowed our important work to continue. The work of the SOM Steering Committee on ECOTECH (SCE) and its fora in 2020 has been guided by the APEC 2020 theme of "Optimising Human Potential towards a Resilient Future of Shared Prosperity: Pivot. Prioritise. Progress" and the ECOTECH medium-term priorities. In addition to carrying on our ongoing work, the SCE and its sub-fora shifted focus to responding to the COVID-19 pandemic through information sharing exercises and the development of new work streams.

The SCE continued to guide the work of its fora. The Committee of the Whole discussions were again structured to better identify cross-fora issues and opportunities, and identify synergies between host economy priorities and fora work streams. A good example of this approach is SCE's efforts to ensure its sub-fora respond to the priority afforded women's economic empowerment as a cross-cutting issue through the La Serena Roadmap for Women and Inclusive Growth, beginning in 2019. Continued emphasis on cross-fora collaborations continue to increase collaborative work streams amongst SCE fora and between SCE fora and the Committee on Trade and Investment (CTI) and the Economic Committee (EC) and their fora.

Consistent with our ambition to have a well-governed, streamlined organization, the SCE has begun a new fora assessment program. The first fora assessed using this standardized system was the Small and Medium Enterprises Working Group (SMEWG). 2021 will see the remaining fourteen sub-fora assessed. This will allow the SCE to have an entire suite of fora assessments prior to the expiration of Terms of Reference in 2020 and 2021. In addition to ensuring each fora's Terms of Reference are fit-for-purpose, this process will force some decisions about which fora have served their purpose. In an effort to develop an APEC wide standardized fora assessment system, the SCE worked with the CTI and the EC to develop substantially similar fora assessment programs across APEC.

This Report highlights some of the many activities of the SCE working groups and policy partnerships. These activities are guided by the ECOTECH medium term priorities and the APEC Strategy for Strengthening Quality Growth, including its focus on institution building, social inclusion, and environmental impact. I am pleased to highlight that the efforts of SCE and its sub-fora in 2020 contributed to the development of key APEC deliverables in the areas of reducing marine debris; combatting illegal, unreported and unregulated fishing; women in the economy and small and medium enterprises among many others.

We continue to advocate for inclusive growth and sustainability by highlighting our achievements that seek to address the social effects of trade.

In presenting this Report, I wish to acknowledge the commitment, hard work, and contributions of APEC members, the SCE sub-fora and our dedicated fora Chairs and Lead Shepherds. I would also like to thank the APEC Secretariat for hosting SCE and SCE sub-fora meetings.

As my time as SCE Chair comes to an end, I welcome Thailand as the incoming SCE Chair, and I look forward to working closely with them.

Executive Summary

In 2020, the SOM Committee on Economic and Technical Cooperation (SCE) held four meetings. One in-person meeting in the margins of Senior Officials Meetings (SOM) and three others hosted by the APEC Secretariat and conducted via videoconference with Mr. Mark Talbot as Chair. Mr. Talbot is New Zealand's Senior Official for APEC. The SCE Vice Chair was Ms. Asmidar Abdul Rahman from Malaysia. The SCE also organized the 15th annual SCE Committee of the Whole (SCE-COW) meeting and an informal meeting of SCE sub-fora Chairs and Lead Shepherds. In addition, the SCE also conducted business through intersessional discussion.

The SCE continues to play its central role in the administration of SCE sub-fora. SCE approved 15 Annual Work Plans. After the pandemic declaration in March 2020, and the resulting travel restrictions, the SCE requested SCE sub-fora submit Work Plan Addendums outlining any changes to work plans including the addition of COVID-19 related work. All SCE sub-fora submitted revised work plans or work plan addendums. In addition, the SCE also reviewed and endorsed SCE sub-fora longer-term Strategic Plans as required. The SCE undertook assessment of the SMEWG in 2020 and developed plans to assess the remaining 14 SCE sub-fora in 2021.

In addition to SCE's central role in the administration of SCE sub-fora, SCE also oversees and coordinates SCE sub-fora. Some of the notable outcomes this year include:

The Policy Partnership on Women and the Economy (PPWE) supported Malaysia in its hosting of the Women and the Economy Forum in September 2020, which included a High Level Policy Dialogue on Women. The PPWE's key output this year is the La Serena Roadmap for Women and Inclusive Growth Implementation Plan.

The Health Working Group (HWG) and Life Sciences Innovation Forum (LSIF) co-contributed to the 10th APEC High Level Meeting (HLM10) on Health and the Economy with the theme as "Building a Resilient Asia-Pacific in a COVID-19 World".

The Oceans and Fisheries Working Group (OFWG) two key outputs this year were the APEC Roadmap on Marine Debris Implementation Plan and the Implementation Plan for the APEC Roadmap on Combatting Illegal, Unreported, and Unregulated (IUU) Fishing.

The Small and Medium Enterprises Working Group (SMEWG) contributed to the 26th APEC SME Ministerial Meeting (SMEMM) held in October. During SMEMM, the SMEWG Chair presented the main outcomes of the work done last year by SMEWG including the Business Ethics for APEC SMEs Initiative: Vision 2025.

Four APEC economies made financial contributions to the APEC Support Fund's various sub-funds. A discussion of the above and other highlights and priorities are set out in Section 2.

Section 3 gives an overview of all sub-fora governance documents. Each forum also reports on projects, both funded by APEC and self-funded by economies, undertaken in 2020 through Fora in Action tables. The tables include information on which projects and other initiatives of SCE sub-fora

addressed the ECOTECH medium term priorities. Additionally, the Fora in Action tables include the achievements of each SCE sub-fora since the 2019 Report.

Recommendations

The following recommendations are proposed to the 2020 APEC Ministerial Meeting (AMM):

- 1. Note the 2020 Senior Officials' Report on Economic and Technical Cooperation;
- 2. Welcome the La Serena Roadmap for Women and Inclusive Growth Implementation Plan;
- 3. Welcome the achievements of the SCE Working Groups and Policy Partnerships; and
- 4. Welcome 2020 contributions to the APEC Support Funds various sub-funds from Australia; Japan; Korea; and Chinese Taipei.

1. Introduction

In 2020, the SCE was chaired by Mr Mark Talbot, APEC Senior Official for New Zealand. The SCE Vice Chair was Ms Asmidar Abdul Rahman, for Malaysia.

The Committee met on four occasions during 2020 and accomplished the following:

- a. developed a standardized for aassessment template and timeline for assessment and delivery to the SCE
- b. assessed the SMEWG and renewed the SMEWG's mandate;
- c. discussed ECOTECH policy initiatives and project proposals;
- d. coordinated the work of SCE sub-fora in response to the COVID-19 pandemic;
- e. facilitated the work of SCE sub-fora by providing direction on Work Plans, Strategic Plans, and Terms of Reference.

The first SCE meeting in 2020 was held on 18 February 2020 in Putrajaya, Malaysia. The SCE established and approved the 2020 SCE Work Plan (2020/SOM1/SCE/002) and the 2020-2023 Terms of Reference (2020/SOM1/SCE/003). The SCE decided to delay the medium-term ECOTECH Review until 2021, to better align medium-term ECOTECH priorities with the forthcoming post-2020 vision. The 2020 Assessment Team was formed of current, and incoming SCE Chair economies (Malaysia, New Zealand and Thailand) and the volunteer economies Australia, Canada, China, Chinese Taipei, and United States. Australia and Canada further volunteered to be the Assessment Team lead economies.

The annual SCE Committee of the Whole (SCE-COW) was held in Putrajaya, on 18 February 2020. It was attended by 20 APEC member economies and 14 SCE sub-fora convenors or their representatives. The SCE approved 10 sub-fora work plans. The SCE noted that only eight of the 15 available work plans contained outcome-related references to women's economic issues and/or mentioned the La Serena Roadmap for Women and Inclusive Growth, despite the instructions on the template to include discussion on these items. The SCE reiterated the importance of including outcome-related reference to women's economic issues. The SCE indicated that it would not approve any 2021 work plan that failed to contain outcome-related references to women's economic issues or reference to reporting requirements for the La Serena Roadmap. SCE-COW was preceded by an informal meeting of fora Chairs and Lead Shepherds, together with group discussions based on the 2020 host year's priorities. These earlier discussions, which sought to explore cross-fora issues and opportunities, witnessed particularly active engagement from participants.

Intersessionally, the SCE endorsed five sub-fora 2020 work plans. The SCE also intersessionally endorsed a 2020 Work Plan Addendum Template to facilitate reporting changes to SCE sub-fora work plans in response to COVID-19 pandemic. The SCE also endorsed Malaysia's self-funded project *Multi-year Policy Dialogue on Innovative Waste Management* (SCE 01 2020S).

The APEC Secretariat hosted SCE 2 in a virtual format on 22 July 2020. SCE 2 included the Policy Dialogue on the Circular Economy in furtherance of the 2020 priority: Driving Innovative Sustainability. The SCE was joined by experts from the Ellen MacArthur Foundation, Unilever,

Malaysia's Ministry of Agriculture and Food Industries, and Tsinghua University. The SCE discussed the cross-cutting nature of circular economy concepts which span APEC.

Intersessionally, the SCE endorsed the OFWG's <u>APEC Marine Debris Roadmap Implementation</u> <u>Plan</u> and the <u>Implementation Plan for the Roadmap on Combatting Illegal, Unreported, and</u> <u>Unregulated (IUU) Fishing</u>. The SCE also endorsed New Zealand's self-funded project <u>Case Studies</u> <u>on Advancing Inclusive Economic Growth: Valuing Indigenous Economies within APEC</u> (SCE 02 2020S).

On 23 September 2020, the APEC Secretariat hosted SCE 3 in a virtual format. The SCE endorsed the <u>Senior Officials' Meeting (SOM) Steering Committee on Economic and Technical Cooperation (SCE)</u> <u>Report on Synergies within the Economic and Technical Cooperation (ECOTECH) Agenda 2020</u> (2020/SCE3/007) and the <u>Report of the APEC Secretariat Executive Director on the Alignment of</u> <u>Fora Work Plans with APEC's Overall Vision and Objectives 2020</u> (2020/SCE3/006). The SCE further discussed the standardized fora assessment program and endorsed the <u>Proposed Senior</u> <u>Officials' Meeting (SOM) Steering Committee on Economic and Technical Cooperation (SCE)</u> <u>Standardized Fora Assessment Template 2020</u> (2020/SCE3/003) and the <u>Timeline of Senior Officials'</u> <u>Meeting (SOM) Steering Committee on Economic and Technical Cooperation (SCE)</u> <u>Standardized Fora Assessment Template 2020</u> (2020/SCE3/003) and the <u>Timeline of Senior Officials'</u> <u>Meeting (SOM) Steering Committee on Economic and Technical Cooperation (SCE)</u> <u>Standardized Fora Assessment Template 2020</u> (2020/SCE3/003) and the <u>Timeline of Senior Officials'</u> <u>Meeting (SOM) Steering Committee on Economic and Technical Cooperation (SCE)</u> <u>Sub-Fora</u> <u>Assessments and Reports (2020/SCE3/002)</u>. Understanding that the Terms of Reference of the SMEWG at the end of 2020, the SCE agreed to assess the SMEWG immediately and table the completed assessment at SCE 4.

In October, the SCE oversaw Malaysia's successful self-funded project, Multi-Year Policy Dialogue: Innovative Waste Management. As part of the project, Malaysia hosted a virtual policy dialogue on innovative food waste management on 6 October 2020

The fourth SCE meeting (SCE4) was hosted by the APEC Secretariat on 4 November 2020. The SCE renewed the mandate of the SMEWG for a further four years. The SCE also endorsed the *SMEWG's Terms of Reference 2021-2024* (2020/SCE4/005) and *Strategic Plan 2021-2024* (2020/SCE4/004). In addition, the SCE endorsed the PPWE's *La Serena Roadmap for Women and Inclusive Growth Implementation Plan* (2020/SCE4/006).

Intersessionally, the SCE approved the publication of APEC Case Studies on Inclusive Policies. This Korea initiated Policy Support Unit Project examined case studies provided by the Key Contributing Economies of Canada; Chile; China; Korea; Malaysia; New Zealand; Russia; and Chinese Taipei.

2. 2020 Highlights and Priorities

2.1 Host Economy Priorities

During the year, the SCE and its sub-fora furthered 2020 priorities of Inclusive Economic Participation through Digital Economy and Technology as well as Driving Innovative Sustainability.

a. Inclusive Economic Participation through Digital Economy and Technology

Human Resource Development Working Group (HRDWG) discussed how the digital economy can allow inclusive economic participation even during a pandemic through discussions on the Future of Work. In addition, member economies discussed how to plan for future of work needs taking into consideration the impact of COVID-19 pandemic. Member economies were invited to share best practices and to initiate the development of the APEC Action Strategies on Future of Work Post-COVID-19. The discussion took into account the issues and strategies identified in the existing APEC initiatives including the APEC Framework on Human Resources Development in the Digital Age (2017) and APEC Economic Policy Report on Structural Reform and Human Capital Development (2017). Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, there is an urgent need to review these initiatives and to share best practices in the areas of resilient work environment, skill development, social protection and relevant educational program in the digital age.

Following from the endorsement of the La Serena Roadmap for Women and Inclusive Growth by APEC Ministers in 2019, the PPWE developed the La Serena Roadmap Implementation Plan in 2020. The Implementation Plan will provide direction to APEC fora and sub-fora in determining current and new work streams that may contribute to fulfilling the Roadmap's key action areas and meeting its targets. It also establishes a process for monitoring, reporting and reviewing progress that will be overseen by Senior Officials. The PPWE will engage with other APEC fora and sub-fora to support collective efforts toward implementing the Roadmap.

SMEWG held the APEC Young Entrepreneurs Kick-Off with the objective of imparting relevant skills and knowledge to young entrepreneurs to unleash their potential, build up their entrepreneurship skills and knowledge in growing the business; and share ideas and experience between participants and mentors from the pool of successful entrepreneurs.

b. Driving Innovative Sustainability

In an effort to further the innovative sustainability discussion, the SCE held a policy dialogue on circular economy concepts as part of SCE 2. The SCE was joined by experts from the Ellen MacArthur Foundation; Unilever, Singapore; Malaysia's Ministry of Agriculture Research and Development Institute; and Tsinghua University. The conversation centered on the cross-cutting nature of circular economy concepts and resource efficiency. In addition to discussing the reduction in plastic use and waste, the SCE also discussed repurposing agricultural waste by turning it into organic fertilizer for new crops. The SCE also discussed e-waste programs that allow for recycling and repurposing of e-waste such as batteries.

The Agricultural Technical Cooperation Working Group (ATCWG) highlighted the potential of innovative technologies during a policy dialogue addressing food security including digital farming and precision agriculture, vertical farming, traceability using decentralized ledger technology, alternative proteins, waste management, and E-commerce.

Understanding that stable energy supply is essential to achieve sustainable development of all economies and regions the Energy Working Group (EWG) developed the APEC Energy Resiliency

Principle. The principle covers a whole framework and a comprehensive set of factors and initiatives that contribute to improving energy resiliency to disasters. APEC member economies may select and implement the initiatives relevant to each economy's situation. EWG also promoted inclusive and sustainable development in the energy sector by introducing relevant initiatives to enhance energy access towards sustainable economic recovery. The EWG held a policy dialogue at EWG 58 and 59 that centered on the priority of driving innovative sustainability, namely Renewable Energy Transition for Sustainable Growth. EWG members discussed the policy paper "Renewable Energy Transition for Sustainable Growth" provided by the Asia Pacific Sustainable Energy Center with collaboration with Malaysia and Expert Group on New and Renewable Energy Technology and exchanged their views. The paper highlighted that to realise energy transition and shaping green economic growth, it is important to improve business environments and promote business activities, including organising knowledge sharing and relevant capacity development programs, fostering public-private partnerships for dissemination of innovative technologies, and development of relevant products services and renewable projects.

The APEC Experts' Group on Illegal Logging and Associated Trade (EGILAT) conducted work seeking to understand the challenges faced by private sector entities throughout the timber supply chain in trading in legally harvested forest products. In addition, the EGILAT explored measures that have, or could be, adopted to overcome these challenges and identified the existing resources or materials that are available to help private sector entities trade in legally harvested forest products.

Following the endorsement of the APEC Roadmap on Marine Debris by Ministers in 2019, the OFWG developed the *APEC Marine Debris Roadmap Implementation Plan* (2020/SCE3/013). The Marine Debris Implementation Plan was developed to provide more specific action, direction and prioritization for the OFWG and APEC more broadly. The OFWG also developed the *Implementation Plan for the Roadmap on Combatting Illegal, Unregulated, and Unreported (IUU) Fishing* (2020/SCE3/014). The IUU Implementation Plan identifies possible work streams to guide the work of implementation of the Roadmap and advance concerted actions to be achieved by 2025.

The Policy Partnership on Science, Technology, and Innovation (PPSTI) conducted *Promoting Innovation City Development in APEC Region and Cooperation to Contribute to Regional integration* 4.0 and Sustainable Growth, which examined the concept of innovative cities.

2.2 COVID-19 Response

Several SCE sub-fora commenced new work in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. The majority where informal information sharing exercises that allowed APEC members to share information on lessons learned.

The Emergency Preparedness Working Group (EPWG) initiated voluntary information sharing on COVID-19 measures, particularly measures related to emergency preparedness among EPWG economies in April 2020. The initiative encourages sharing and learning about COVID-19 response based on each economy's experience. This information can be found on the APEC website.

The EWG has started to study COVID-19 effects on energy situation, policy and targets in a holistic approach from three aspects (security of supply and demand, safety of infrastructures, welfare of peoples and communities).

The networks of the HRDWG held special COVID-19 related meetings. The Education Network (ED-NET) developed a survey for members that collected information on impact of COVID-19 on education in member economies. The survey covered challenges and obstacles encountered in education when fighting against COVID-19, effective solutions to the challenge, and recommendations for future of education, covering four sections such as preschool, basic education, higher education, and vocational & technical education and training. The ED-NET then met to discuss the education response to COVID-19. The Labour and Social Protection Network (LSPN) also held a special session on COVID-19.

The PPSTI members agreed to endeavor to share their experiences, lessons learned, and best practices under STI areas to support capacity building and innovation, encourage further collaboration in STI, and better inform policy recommendations for improving health systems and resilience planning in the APEC region.

The PPWE held a dedicated session in which economies exchanged views on their respective governments' women-focused responses to the COVID-19 pandemic. Economies compared information on the impacts of the pandemic and economic downturn on women's economic empowerment, and they identified specific policy responses initiated or under development. The PPWE also held a public-private policy dialogue in which business representatives shared information on private sector initiatives to increase women's economic participation in their industries during economic recovery.

The SMEWG started an informal and voluntary information-sharing exercise on measures implemented by APEC economies to foster SMEs resilience during the current COVID-19 crisis.

The Telecommunications and Information Working Group (TELWG) endorsed "APEC TEL Initiative on Global Challenges and Cooperation Utilizing ICT - COVID-19 Pandemic and Beyond". This document outlines possible areas for initiatives that would address current COVID-19 and other prospective global challenges (in the future), especially by utilizing ICT and emerging digital technology. In addition, this document can serve to provide some focus and direction for TELWG's future work and also as the basis to engage in cross-fora collaboration in relation to combatting COVID-19.

2.3 Fora Administration

a. Making Recommendations to SOM on the Terms of Reference of SCE Fora

In accordance with the SCE Terms of Reference, the SCE has the mandate to "review the role and operation of Working Groups and Task Forces with a view to making recommendations to the SOM on establishing, merging, disbanding or reorienting" such working groups and task forces. In 2020, the SCE discussed how to manage the expiration of all SCE sub-fora Terms of Reference in 2020 and 2021. The SCE is currently assessing all sub-fora using a standardized template that will allow the SCE to make recommendations on merging, disbanding, or reorienting sub-fora. Please see Table 1 for an overview of fora administration.

b. Approving Strategic Plans

In 2020, the SCE approved one Strategic Plan: Tourism Working Group 2021-2024.

c. Approving Annual Work Plans

The Terms of Reference of SCE, as reconfirmed in 2020, mandates SCE to "assess and direct realignment of individual work plans of Working Groups and SOM Policy Partnerships with the APEC-wide medium-term ECOTECH priorities and annual objectives as outlined in the ECOTECH framework" and stipulates that "to this purpose, all Working Groups and Policy Partnerships should submit their strategic and annual work plans to the SCE no later than three weeks prior to SOM 1 for consideration at the SCE-Committee of the Whole." Fifteen work plans were submitted and approved by SCE in 2020 (as reflected in Table 1).

At SCE3 in 2020, the Executive Director of the APEC Secretariat presented a report, *Alignment of Fora Work Plans with APEC's Overall Vision and Objectives* (2020/SCE3/003) which noted that most SCE sub-fora focused their activities to respond to the mandates given to them by the Leaders and Ministers. Many sub-fora, such as Anti-Corruption and Transparency Working Group, Counter Terrorism Working Group; Experts Group on Illegal Logging and Associated Trade; Emergency Preparedness Working Group; Energy Working Group; Human Resources Development Working Group; Health Working Group; Oceans and Fisheries Working Group; Policy Partnership on Women and the Economy; Small and Medium Enterprises Working Group; and Tourism Working Group, specifically cite recent instructions of Ministers. A number of these also refer to 2020 APEC priorities. Most notably, all work plans also make linkages between their specific activities and the relevant ECOTECH Medium Term Priorities, which is facilitated by continued use of a template.

2.4 Revised, Standardized Fora Assessment System

In 2006, the SCE was mandated to conduct a review of APEC working groups and task forces and make recommendations to Senior Officials on establishing, merging, disbanding and reorienting these bodies. Ministers endorsed the recommendations of the SCE review and instructed the SCE to continue efforts to improve the operation and work of its fora (2006/CSOM/14). A program of independent assessments was then developed to evaluate all SCE working groups and task forces every four years and support periodic review processes.

In 2016, the SCE Chair proposed, and members accepted, to conduct a review of the Independent Assessment program. Delegations shared the view that fora assessments should be undertaken in the view of providing broader organizational perspectives and facilitating possible rationalization. Delegations also noted the lack of understanding of APEC among certain assessors, uneven follow-up on recommendations and inconsistencies between the review of fora Terms of References and their assessment schedules. Following this, the Secretariat presented a discussion paper to SCE2 (2016/SOM2/SCE/003), which addressed a number of issues, including quality, focus, schedules across different review and monitoring processes, post-assessment measures and attendant financial/administrative burdens.

At SCE3 in 2016, the SCE approved the Decisions on Fora Assessment as proposed by the Chair (2016/SOM3/SCE/011), the main elements of which include developments of a standardized program for assessments, the establishment of an Assessment Team comprising the representatives from the preceding, current, and subsequent SCE Chairing economies, as well as any other volunteering economies with the assistance from the Secretariat; further follow-up by the Assessment Team on the recommendations; and an optional Comprehensive Fora Review following a full cycle of assessments on all the SCE fora.

In 2018, a standardized template for fora assessment was endorsed by SCE (2018/SOM1/SCE/0024). This template was then used to assess four SCE sub-fora in 2018 (as per Table 1). Upon receipt of the four fora assessments, the Assessment Team determined that the information contained in the reports was not sufficient to allow them to make any recommendations to SCE.

At SCE1 in 2019, there was discussion regarding the current standardized fora assessment program. Several economies expressed concern regarding the expense of the current program, the length of the reports produced, and the overall usefulness of the resulting reports. A decision was taken to pause the program while the Assessment Team discussed alternative methods of fora assessment.

In 2020 the Assessment Team proposed a new standardized report template. This new standardized report template was endorsed at SCE 3. The first sub-fora assessed using the template was the SMEWG with results tabled at SCE4.

2.5 Cross-Fora Collaboration

Increasing cross-fora collaboration has been under discussion in recent years. A 15th meeting of SCE Fora Chairs and Lead Shepherds (SCE-Committee of the Whole) was held on 18 February 2020 in Putrajaya, Malaysia. Chairs and Lead Shepherds or their representatives from 14 of the 15 SCE fora participated. The presence of Chairs, Lead Shepherds or their representatives increased their interactions with each other and Senior Officials, leading to useful practical suggestions for collaborating with other APEC fora. Also at SCE 3 2020, the APEC Secretariat introduced its report, *"SCE Report on Synergies within the ECOTECH Agenda"* (2020/SCE/007). To further underscore the importance of cross-fora collaboration, fora are required to report on their cross-fora collaborations in annual fora reports. In addition, the standardized fora assessment program also measures data and indicators relating to cross-fora collaboration. In 2020, SCE and its sub-fora have 100+ projects in implementation. Of those projects, over 30% of them include some manner of cross-fora collaboration hold joint meetings with other SCE sub-fora as well as with EC and CTI and its sub-fora.

2.6 APEC Support Fund

In 2004, Ministers endorsed the Australian proposal to set up the APEC Support Fund (ASF) to serve as a flexible funding mechanism. The ASF aims to meet the capacity building needs for developing economy members in APEC's agreed high priority sectors for economic and technical cooperation. Since its inception, the fund has received contributions from many economies.

Voluntary contributions by APEC members to the ASF and its sub-funds in 2020 (as of 4 November 2020) were made or committed by four economies: Australia; Japan; Korea; and Chinese Taipei.

Australia provided USD 398,524 to the ASF General Fund, after redirection of the uncommitted balance of the ASF Mining Sub-Fund after cessation of the ASF Mining Sub-Fund (subject to SOMs approval) and USD 204,750 to the ASF Marine Debris Management and Innovation Sub-fund.

Japan provided USD 1,057,283 to the ASF Energy Efficiency and Low Carbon Measures Sub-fund.

Korea provided a contribution of USD 700,000 to the ASF Digital Innovation Sub-fund.

Chinese Taipei provided a contribution of USD 1,450,000 split amongst the ASF Digital Innovation Sub-fund, the ASF Human Security Sub-fund, and the ASF Marine Debris Management and Innovation Sub-fund.

4. Recommendations

The following recommendations are proposed to the 2020 APEC Ministerial Meeting (AMM):

- 1. Note the 2020 Senior Officials' Report on Economic and Technical Cooperation;
- 2. Welcome the La Serena Roadmap for Women and Inclusive Growth Implementation Plan
- 3. Welcome the achievements of the SCE Working Groups and Policy Partnerships; and
- 4. Welcome 2020 contributions to the APEC Support Fund's various sub-funds from Australia; Japan; Korea; and Chinese Taipei.

SOM Steering Committee on Economic and Technical Cooperation 2020 Work Plan

1. Proposed Work for 2020 in Response to Leaders/Ministers/SOM Decisions and SCE Priorities.

- Provide policy recommendations that are related to ECOTECH groups to SOM;
- Coordinate and supervise all ECOTECH-related Working Groups and Policy Partnerships, including reviewing and recommending any fora's ToR revision to SOM;
- Review the operation and effectiveness of the SCE;
- Provide policy guidance on the ECOTECH agenda in the development of sub-fora strategic plans;
- Continue to implement SCE's Decision on Standardized Fora Assessment program;
- Determine eligibility and score concept notes applying for funding under ASF sub-funds assigned to the responsibility of the SCE; and,
- Consolidate the SCE Fora Reports and prepare annual SOM Report on ECOTECH to Ministers.
- 2. Strengthening coordination among and across sub-fora
 - Promote cross-fora collaboration across APEC sub-fora, including through implementation of the 2016 Recommendations on Cross-Fora Collaboration together with the 2017 APEC Guidelines on Promoting Cross-Fora Collaboration;
 - Review and consider any possible options to make the SCE and SCE COW arrangements more effective; and
 - Supervise or coordinate cross-cutting issues and specific initiatives assigned to SCE.
- 3. Expected Outcomes/Deliverables for 2020
 - Implementation of Standardized Fora Assessment Program, including convening of the Assessment Team for 2020;
 - Consideration of new ways to strengthen cross for collaboration through the SCE process;
 - Approval of the SCE sub-fora's annual work plans;
 - Review and approval of the Strategic Plans for those sub-fora with expiring strategic plans;

- Review and recommendation of the revised ToRs of certain sub-fora to SOM, including in connection with governance reforms agreed by SOM in 2017;
- Submission of the annual SOM Report on ECOTECH to Ministers at AMM 2020; and
- Review and make recommendation to SOM on those sub-fora with expiring Terms of Reference

SCE Report on Synergies within the ECOTECH Agenda 2020

Background

- 1. The SCE has tasked "the Secretariat to undertake a strategic assessment of synergies within the ECOTECH agenda after SOM1 and provide recommendations to SCE2 about gaps that may require SCE attention or direction" (point 7 of *SCE Report on Improving ECOTECH in APEC* (2013/SOM3/030)).
- 2. The first report by the APEC Secretariat (2014/SOM2/SCE/004) was submitted to the SCE2 in 2014. The second report was presented to the SCE2 in 2015.
- 3. The 2020 report has been rationalised somewhat from previous versions. The fora work plans are not attached. One is invited to review the 2020 Work Plans of the SCE sub-fora on the SCE ACS page. In addition, the template has been refined in recent years to request sub-fora to specify which other sub-fora or organisations it plans to collaborate with, and how. Similar reporting is sought in the template for annual Fora Reports submitted later in the APEC year.

Review of the annual work plans of the SCE fora

- 4. The APEC Secretariat analysed fifteen (15) sub-fora work plans: ACTWG, ATCWG, CTWG, EGILAT, EPWG, EWG, HRDWG, HWG, OFWG, PPSTI, PPWE, SMEWG, TELWG, TPTWG, and TWG submitted as of 6 March 2020. The Secretariat analysis came to the following broad conclusions:
 - SCE sub-fora identified almost 200 areas of potential cross-fora collaboration.
 - Potential collaboration is being identified with other SCE sub-fora as well as with the sub-fora of the Economic Committee, the Committee on Trade and Investment, and the Finance Ministers Process/Senior Finance Officials' Meeting.
 - Collaboration is not confined to the same or the more obvious partners but rather is diverse, and often differs from project to project.
 - There are new collaboration partners, which had not previously been seen in APEC. One example is ACTWG and PPWE collaborating to host a symposium on Gender Mainstreaming and Women's Empowerment to Fight Corruption. Another is EPWG and SFOM on disaster risk financing.
 - The most active sub-fora in terms of collaboration are PPWE and SMEWG. The sub-fora with the fewest self-reported collaborations are PPSTI and TELWG however both of these sub-fora are identified by other SCE sub-fora as potential cross-fora collaboration partners.
 - A number of SCE sub-fora identify potential collaboration with external partners, including international and regional organisations such as the United Nations, World Bank, Asian Development Bank, INTERPOL, International Energy Agency, ILO, WHO and OECD, or non-governmental organisations such as the International Air Transport Association and Transparency International, to name but a few.

- Work plans continue to include fairly modest details on the nature and extent of such collaboration.
- Although certain work plans have identified potential collaboration with ABAC and ASEAN, there likely is scope for more frequent collaboration with both entities, together with Pacific Islands Forum Secretariat, given their respective roles within the broader APEC process.

Review of the revised work plans and work plan addendums of SCE fora

- 5. As a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, the ability of fora to meet and conduct the work previously outlined on endorsed work plans.
- 6. The SCE Chair requested each for a submit a work plan addendum outlining the work that had been postponed, changed, or cancelled due to COVID-19. disrupted.
- 7. The APEC Secretariat analysed fourteen (14) sub-fora work plans: ACTWG, ATCWG, CTWG, EGILAT, EPWG, EWG, HWG, OFWG, PPSTI, PPWE, SMEWG, TELWG, TPTWG, and TWG submitted as of 24 August 2020. The Secretariat analysis came to the following broad conclusions:
 - While all for have changed or postponed meetings and project events originally scheduled for 2020, the core work of APEC continues.
 - The majority of fora have conducted virtual plenary meetings or have virtual plenary meetings scheduled before the end of 2020. In addition, the majority of fora have shifted project events to virtual platforms.
 - Several SCE for have commenced new work relating to COVID-19 including response and economic recovery. Examples of this work include:
 - EWG, PPWE, and SMEWG have requested members voluntarily share sector specific economy responses and policies.
 - TELWG is considering a new project to address the global challenges and cooperation on COVID-19 utilizing ICT.
 - TWG will conduct activities on emergency preparedness measures by APEC economies for the tourism industry.

Discussion on how to promote cross-fora collaboration

- 8. At SCE3 in 2016, SCE members adopted eight recommendations to promote cross-fora collaboration (see 2016/SOM3/SCE/002).
- 9. The SCE Chair and the Secretariat together with the SCE fora have been implementing these recommendations since SCE3 of 2016. In 2020, a thematic discussion focussed on key fora deliverables and cross-fora opportunities was at the heart of the SCE-COW agenda. The CTI, EC, BMC, ABAC, and SFOM Chairs were invited to attend the 2020 SCE-COW. The Secretariat maintains all key documents of the SCE fora (ie Terms of References, Strategic Plans, annual Work Plans and annual Fora Reports) on the APEC Collaboration System (ACS). Remote participation is facilitated when requested, including in the context of 2020 SOM1 cluster meetings. The Secretariat also hosts virtual meetings as necessary to facilitate the ongoing work of SCE and SCE fora.

10. In 2017, APEC Ministers welcomed the adoption of the *APEC Guidelines on Promoting Cross-Fora Collaboration*, which streamline existing best practices and highlight emerging issues in the view of encouraging more effective collaboration APEC-wide.

Report of the APEC Secretariat Executive Director on the Alignment of Fora Work Plans with APEC's Overall Vision and Objectives 2020

Introduction

- 1. In line with the recommendations for *Strengthening Economic and Technical Cooperation in APEC* issued in 2010, the APEC Secretariat Executive Director provides an annual report on how SCE sub-fora work plans address APEC's overall vision and objectives.
- 2. The SCE sub-fora annual work plans are tabled at the annual SCE-Committee of the Whole Meeting (SCE-COW) seeking approval in accordance with the recommendations of the 2010 ECOTECH Report.
- 3. The 2020 alignment report considers how well the activities set out in the work plans align with the priorities established by Leaders and Ministers and the annual 2020 APEC priorities.
- 4. After SCE sub-fora work plans were endorsed by the SCE, the region experienced significant travel disruptions as a result of COVID-19. These changes required sub-fora to reevaluate work plans, including postponing work and/or focusing on new work.

Status of Work Plan Submission

- 5. The SCE Terms of Reference stipulate that Working Groups and Policy Partnerships should submit their annual work plans three weeks prior to the annual SCE-COW on the margins of SCE1. The APEC Secretariat analysed fifteen (15) sub-fora work plans: Anti-Corruption Working Group; Agricultural Technical Cooperation Working Group; Counter-Terrorism Working Group; Experts Group on Illegal Logging and Associated Trade; Emergency Preparedness Working Group; Energy Working Group; Human Resources Development Working Group; Health Working Group; Oceans and Fisheries Working Group; Policy Partnership for Science, Technology, and Innovation; Policy Partnership for Women and the Economy; Small and Medium Enterprises Working Group; and Tourism Working Group as of 6 March 2020.
- 6. The work plans of Agricultural Technical Cooperation Working Group; Anti-Corruption and Transparency Working Group; Experts' Group on Illegal Logging and Associated Trade; Energy Working Group; Human Resources Development Working Group; Policy Partnership on Science, Technology, and Innovation; Policy Partnership on Women and the Economy; Small and Medium Enterprises Working Group; Telecommunications Working Group; and Transportation Working Group were submitted at SCE-COW as they were endorsed by the respective sub-fora.
- 7. The SCE sub-fora are asked to develop their work plans in accordance with a template approved at SCE2 2016. In 2017, guidance was added to the template to encourage identification of gender-related initiatives or aspects thereof. Additional guidance was provided in 2019 to focus reporting on those deliverables that align with the 2019 priorities.
- 8. The Secretariat conducted an analysis of the work plans and came to the following general conclusions:

Alignment of Work Plans with Broader APEC Objectives

- The majority of SCE sub-fora (12 out of 15) focused their activities to respond to the mandates given to them by the Leaders and Ministers. The majority of sub-fora, such as ATCWG, EPWG, OFWG, and TWG specifically cite recent instructions of Ministers.
- Almost all work plans (14 out of 15) refer to 2020 APEC priorities.
- All work plans also make linkages between their specific activities and the relevant ECOTECH Medium Term Priorities, which is facilitated by the template.
- 7 of the 15 work plans have specific references to gendered perspective projects or work streams.

Planning Elements (Cross-fora collaboration, Capacity Building and Expected Deliverables)

- All submitted work plans identify some degree of collaboration with other sub-fora on crosscutting topics. The Secretariat presents its analysis in a separate paper.
- Most initiatives and projects have been identified as capacity building, which is in keeping with ECOTECH priorities.
- Only eight of the work plans responded to the work plan guidance seeking identification of gender-related initiatives or aspect thereof.
- There remains room for improvement amongst sub-fora work plans focusing on deliverables, or outputs and outcomes, which advance APEC priorities, rather than on activities and routine administrative issues.
- Reforms to the SCE-COW arrangements have aided a focus on concrete deliverables.

Changes in response to COVID-19

- 9. Six of the 15 sub-fora added work to their work plan in response to COVID-19.
- 10. All sub-fora postponed work planned for 2020
- 11. All sub-fora had meeting schedules and project events rescheduled as a result of COVD-19.
- 12. Sub-fora have largely moved to virtual platforms for meetings. These meetings have been facilitated by Malaysia, the APEC Secretariat, and the economies of the various Chairs/Lead Shepherds.

Secretariat Comment

- 13. A further reminder that work plans contain gender-related initiatives and implementation plans for the La Serena Roadmap on Women and Inclusive Growth should be added to the 2021 template to reiterate Senior Officials' continued commitment to these issues.
- 14. A reminder to continue with ongoing work in the face of COVID-19 will keep APEC moving.

15. A continued emphasis on expected deliverables in work plan preparation could aide Senior Officials and conveners in maximizing capacity building through cross-fora collaboration.



Implementation Plan "La Serena Roadmap for Women and Inclusive Growth (2019-2030)"

Ensuring the greater integration and empowerment of women in the Asia Pacific region

Introduction

In October 2019, Ministers at the Women and Economy Forum (WEF) welcomed the La Serena Roadmap for Women and Inclusive Growth in La Serena, Chile. In December 2019 in Singapore, on behalf of APEC Ministers, APEC Senior Officials endorsed the Roadmap, which seeks to provide guidance and catalyze policy actions to promote the empowerment of women in the Asia Pacific region.

APEC recognizes that despite progress, women's growing contribution to the global economy has not reached its full potential, even more so in the context of the current COVID-19 pandemic, which has had negative effects on women's economic participation in some economies. In response, the Roadmap seeks to encourage strategies and APEC-wide action and collaboration across fora, and with the APEC Business Advisory Council (ABAC) and other relevant stakeholders to address the region's most pressing challenges limiting women's economic empowerment.

Purpose of the Implementation Plan

This Implementation Plan serves as a framework to provide comprehensive and cross-cutting direction for APEC fora and sub-fora in determining relevant existing and new work streams that may contribute to meeting the targets and fulfilling Action Areas of the La Serena Roadmap for Women and Inclusive Growth.

This Implementation Plan is intended to be a practical, targeted and coordinated document responsive to changing and urgent needs of APEC member economies. An ongoing dialogue, facilitated by the Policy Partnership on Women and the Economy (PPWE) with other APEC fora, will be maintained on the achievement of its actions and new activities may be added at any time to support the Roadmap's targets.

The Implementation Plan also establishes reporting and reviewing mechanisms, in line with fora's existing formal review processes, to keep APEC Senior Officials and Ministers updated on the progress in the implementation of the Roadmap.

Guiding Principles

Implementation of the Roadmap will be guided by the following principles:

- Delivering on La Serena Roadmap's Key Action Areas and Targets.
- Building on existing APEC work on women's economic empowerment and responding to Leaders' forward vision for APEC.
- Collaborating in areas of common interest, between economies, among the PPWE, APEC fora and sub-fora, the APEC Business Advisory Council (ABAC) and with regional and international organizations, as appropriate.
- Exploring actions to identify and mitigate the impacts of COVID-19 pandemic on women's economic empowerment and prepare for resilient and inclusive recovery efforts.
- Continuous monitoring and reporting of progress, gaps and challenges related to the Roadmap's implementation, as well as assessing and mitigating risks to ensure interventions aimed at increasing women's empowerment do not inadvertently reinforce or increase inequality.

• Referencing the APEC Women and the Economy Dashboard to support implementation efforts, as appropriate. The Dashboard outlines 95 indicators classified in five areas ¹⁹ identified as priorities by the APEC Policy Partnership on Women and the Economy (PPWE).

La Serena Roadmap for Women and Inclusive Growth

From the La Serena Roadmap these are the Key Action Areas and Targets previously endorsed by the APEC economies:

Key Action Areas

- A. Empowering women through access to capital and markets
- B. Strengthening women's labor force participation
- C. Improving access of women to leadership positions in all levels of decision making
- D. Support women's education, training and skills development and access in a changing world of work
- E. Advancing women's economic empowerment through data collection and analysis

Targets

- Have in place laws, policies, and regulations that prohibit discrimination on the basis of sex in employment access, opportunities and conditions
- Have in place non-discrimination laws, policies and regulations that provide equal access to capital and credit for both sexes
- Increase the region's gender balance among STEM graduates in tertiary education, and in positions in research and R&D
- Increase the region's gender balance in leadership positions, closing the gap for women

Completion, Monitoring, and Reporting process

Framework completion

- All APEC fora and sub-fora, including the PPWE, will be asked to complete the "**Key Actions Framework**", using the suggested guiding questions to advance the Key Actions Areas identified in the Roadmap. APEC fora and sub-fora will be asked to complete voluntarily the "Key Actions Framework" (in Section VII) every 2 years, beginning in 2021, prior to the Steering Committee on Economic and Technical Cooperation Committee of the Whole (SCE-COW). For key terminology and how to consider impacts and empower women through Strategic Plans and Work Plans, Annual Reports and Projects, APEC fora and subfora are advised to consult the available resources on the APEC Website.
- Each fora's completed and endorsed "Key Actions Framework" will then be shared with the PPWE which, in support of Senior Officials, will coordinate this process, submit a consolidation of the frameworks to Senior Officials through the SCE and circulate for information the same with APEC fora and sub-fora and make it accessible on the APEC Website.

¹⁹ PPWE core priorities are as follows: (1) access to capital and assets; (2) access to markets; (3) skills, capacity building, and health; (4) leadership, voice, and agency; (5) and innovation and technology.

Reporting and Monitoring

- Senior Officials have overall responsibility for the monitoring and evaluation progress under the Roadmap.
- To assist Senior Officials, the PPWE will develop and circulate with fora and sub-fora an optional **"Reporting questionnaire"** to undertake an analysis of initiatives and projects agreed under the "Key Actions Framework" to be completed, as appropriate, by relevant APEC fora and sub-fora every two years, by SOM I, beginning in 2023.
- The PPWE will be responsible for the questionnaire's review, consolidation, and reporting to Senior Officials, through the SCE, every two years.
- An update on the progress of the Roadmap's targets will be included in the APEC Women and the Economy Dashboard.
- Senior Officials will report periodically, every two years, beginning in 2023, to Ministers on the Roadmap's progress and seek further guidance, as appropriate, to move forward on the Key Action Areas during its implementation. Senior Officials are encouraged to engage Ministers of both the APEC Ministerial Meeting and the Women and the Economy Forum.

Midterm & Final Review

- The PPWE will conduct a mid-term review of the Roadmap to be carried out in 2026, which will be reported at the APEC Ministerial Meeting and the Women and the Economy Forum (WEF). This review will ensure that APEC-wide and individual actions are in place to complete achievement of the targets of the Roadmap by 2030.
- The PPWE will conduct a final review of the Implementation Plan to be carried out in 2030, which will be reported to the APEC Ministerial Meeting and the Women and the Economy Forum. The review will focus on measuring the progress made by APEC and individual economies on the Roadmap's Key Action Areas and Targets.

VII "Key Actions Framework"

This framework sets out criteria to ensure that compliance and reporting objectives of this Plan are met. It considers current and proposed activities, indicators, outputs, timeframe, and the fora and sub-fora responsible for the activities' execution. The matrix below is a sample that fora and sub-fora should complete, circulate to relevant APEC working groups for inputs, and finally submit to PPWE for overall tracking of APEC efforts.

- Current / Proposed Activities: Each existing or new activity should be described in a short paragraph (i.e. 3-4 sentences) that includes the name, a brief description of the key objectives and main beneficiaries (e.g. Capacity building Workshops, Symposium, Seminar, development of framework/program/online courses, Interview Series, Policy Dialogue, etc.) Fora and sub-fora are strongly encouraged to collaborate on activities and reflect joint efforts in the format below.
- **Outputs:** Identify the key products or services that will happen during the implementation of the activity. These may include workshops, summary reports, ex ante and ex post surveys, analytical inputs, research work, recommendations, best practice guidelines, action plans, policy recommendations, websites etc.
- Indicators: Describe the indicators to be used to measure the project's outputs (e.g. event participation rates, number of speakers engaged disaggregated by sex, number of recommendations made, number of practices shared, reports distributed, etc.)
