




Longer-Term Evaluation of APEC Projects (LTEAP)


Longer-Term Evaluation of APEC Projects (LTEAP) Key results – Requiring Attention X

Longer-Term Evaluation of APEC Projects (LTEAP) Key Areas for Improvement

The 2021 LTEAP returned similar trends and results to the previous three years.

The 3 key areas for improvement in APEC projects remain:



More effective targeting of project participants

Identify participants with the 'right' skills profile, role in organisation



Greater application of project learning by participants at 'home'

Promote improvements to policies and practices in APEC economies



Increased participation rates






Project Completion Reports Annual Project Data (Sep 2020-Oct 2021)




