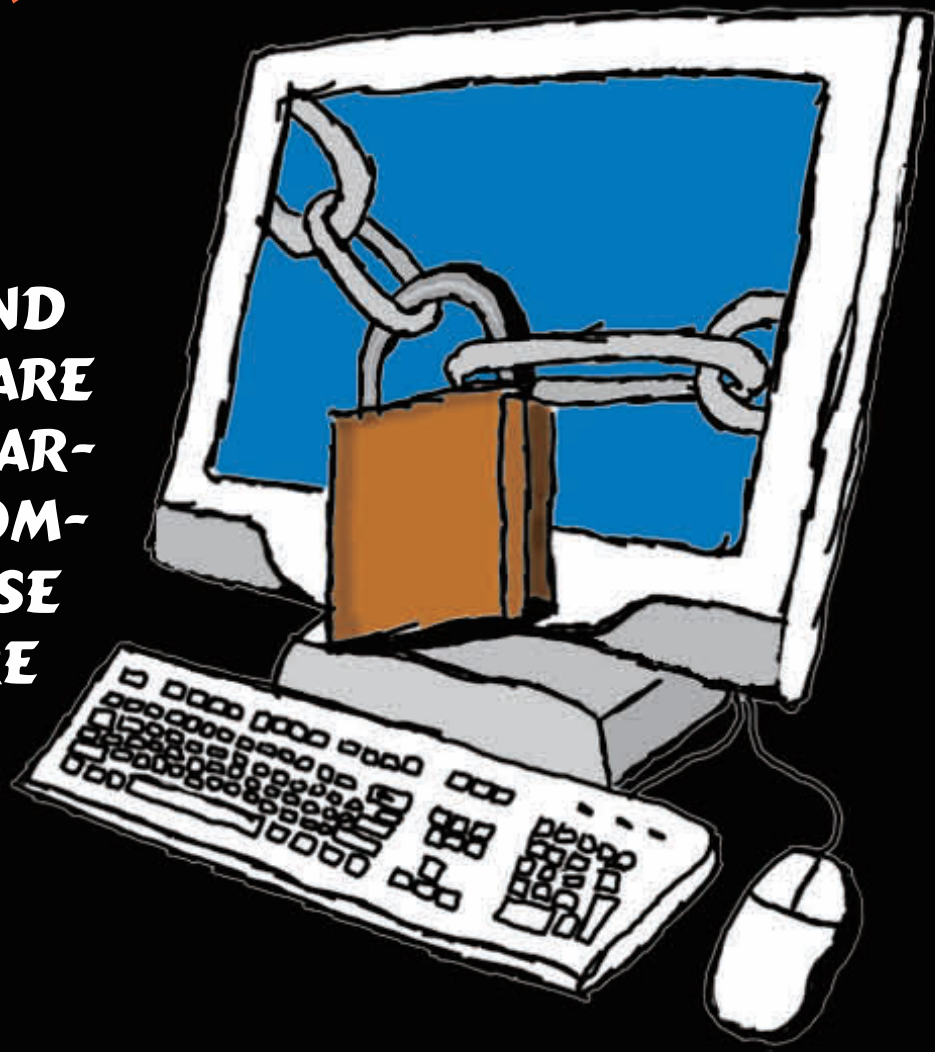


STAY CYBER-SAFE

1 INSTALL SECURITY SOFTWARE AND UPDATE IT REGULARLY

UP TO DATE ANTI-VIRUS AND
FIREWALL SECURITY SOFTWARE
PROGRAMS CAN ACT AS A BAR-
RIER TO PROTECT YOUR COM-
PUTER FROM ATTACK. THESE
ARE EASY TO USE AND ARE
OFTEN FREE.



2 TURN ON AUTOMATIC UP- DATES SO YOUR SOFTWARE RECIEVES THE LATEST FIXES

WITHOUT THE LATEST UPDATES, YOUR SE-
CURITY SOFTWARE MAY NOT BE EFFECTIVE
AGAINST NEW THREATS CREATED AFTER
YOU LAST UPDATED IT. TURNING ON AU-
TOMATIC UPDATES MEANS THAT YOU
DON'T HAVE TO WORRY ABOUT DOING IT
YOURSELF



3 GET A STRONGER PASSWORD AND CHANGE IT AT LEAST TWICE A YEAR

MAKING STRONGER PASS-
WORDS REDUCES THE
CHANCE OF YOUR ACCOUNTS
BEING HACKED INTO.

CHANGING YOUR PASSWORD REGU-
LARLY DECREASES THE CHANCE THAT
SOMEONE COULD STTUMBLE ACCROSS
AN OLD PASSWORD AND USE IT TO LOG
INTO YOUR ACCOUNTS WITHOUT YOUR
KNOWLEDGE.



4 STOP AND THINK BEFORE YOU CLICK ON A LINK OR ATTACHMENT



LINKS AND ATTACHMENTS CAN
CONTAIN VIRUSES AND SPYWARE
THAT INFECT YOUR COMPUTER
AND CAN READ ALL OF YOUR IN-
FORMATION. THE PASSWORDS
YOU USE AND YOUR BANKING
DETAILS

5 STOP AND THINK BEFORE YOU SHARE ANY PERSONAL OR FINANCIAL DETAILS - ABOUT YOURSELF OR YOUR FRIENDS AND FAMILY

PUTTING YOUR PERSONAL OR FI-
NANCIAL DETAILS ONLINE CAN
LEAVE YOU OPEN TO ATTACK -
EITHER FROM HACKERS TRANS-
FERING THE MONEY FROM YOUR
BANK ACCOUNTS OR CREDIT
CARD, OR IDENTITY THEFT. YOU
MUST ALSO BE CAREFUL NOT TO
POST INFORMATION THAT COULD
AFFECT YOUR FAMILY OR
FRIENDS IN A SIMILAR WAY.



6 KNOW WHAT YOUR CHILDREN ARE DOING ONLINE

MAKE SURE THEY
KNOW TO STAY SAFE
AND ENCOURAGE
THEM TO REPORT
ANYTHING SUSPICIOUS
