Letter from the SCE Chair

It is with great pleasure that I present the 2020 APEC Senior Officials' Report on Economic and Technical Cooperation.

Like the rest of the world, the SCE and its sub-fora have had to make adjustments to 2020 plans. We managed to meet in February, but have unfortunately experienced the cancellation of all in-person plenary meetings and project events. The SCE and its sub-fora have still continued the important work of economic and technical cooperation. The SCE and its sub-fora quickly made the switch to virtual meetings which allowed our important work to continue. The work of the SOM Steering Committee on ECOTECH (SCE) and its fora in 2020 has been guided by the APEC 2020 theme of "Optimising Human Potential towards a Resilient Future of Shared Prosperity: Pivot. Prioritise. Progress" and the ECOTECH medium-term priorities. In addition to carrying on our ongoing work, the SCE and its sub-fora shifted focus to responding to the COVID-19 pandemic through information sharing exercises and the development of new work streams.

The SCE continued to guide the work of its fora. The Committee of the Whole discussions were again structured to better identify cross-fora issues and opportunities, and identify synergies between host economy priorities and fora work streams. A good example of this approach is SCE's efforts to ensure its sub-fora respond to the priority afforded women's economic empowerment as a cross-cutting issue through the La Serena Roadmap for Women and Inclusive Growth, beginning in 2019. Continued emphasis on cross-fora collaborations continue to increase collaborative work streams amongst SCE fora and between SCE fora and the Committee on Trade and Investment (CTI) and the Economic Committee (EC) and their fora.

Consistent with our ambition to have a well-governed, streamlined organization, the SCE has begun a new fora assessment program. The first fora assessed using this standardized system was the Small and Medium Enterprises Working Group (SMEWG). 2021 will see the remaining fourteen sub-fora assessed. This will allow the SCE to have an entire suite of fora assessments prior to the expiration of Terms of Reference in 2020 and 2021. In addition to ensuring each fora's Terms of Reference are fit-for-purpose, this process will force some decisions about which fora have served their purpose. In an effort to develop an APEC wide standardized fora assessment system, the SCE worked with the CTI and the EC to develop substantially similar fora assessment programs across APEC.

This Report highlights some of the many activities of the SCE working groups and policy partnerships. These activities are guided by the ECOTECH medium term priorities and the APEC Strategy for Strengthening Quality Growth, including its focus on institution building, social inclusion, and environmental impact. I am pleased to highlight that the efforts of SCE and its sub-fora in 2020 contributed to the development of key APEC deliverables in the areas of reducing marine debris; combatting illegal, unreported and unregulated fishing; women in the economy and small and medium enterprises among many others.

We continue to advocate for inclusive growth and sustainability by highlighting our achievements that seek to address the social effects of trade.

In presenting this Report, I wish to acknowledge the commitment, hard work, and contributions of APEC members, the SCE sub-fora and our dedicated fora Chairs and Lead Shepherds. I would also like to thank the APEC Secretariat for hosting SCE and SCE sub-fora meetings.

As my time as SCE Chair comes to an end, I welcome Thailand as the incoming SCE Chair, and I look forward to working closely with them.

Executive Summary

In 2020, the SOM Committee on Economic and Technical Cooperation (SCE) held four meetings. One in-person meeting in the margins of Senior Officials Meetings (SOM) and three others hosted by the APEC Secretariat and conducted via videoconference with Mr. Mark Talbot as Chair. Mr. Talbot is New Zealand's Senior Official for APEC. The SCE Vice Chair was Ms. Asmidar Abdul Rahman from Malaysia. The SCE also organized the 15th annual SCE Committee of the Whole (SCE-COW) meeting and an informal meeting of SCE sub-fora Chairs and Lead Shepherds. In addition, the SCE also conducted business through intersessional discussion.

The SCE continues to play its central role in the administration of SCE sub-fora. SCE approved 15 Annual Work Plans. After the pandemic declaration in March 2020, and the resulting travel restrictions, the SCE requested SCE sub-fora submit Work Plan Addendums outlining any changes to work plans including the addition of COVID-19 related work. All SCE sub-fora submitted revised work plans or work plan addendums. In addition, the SCE also reviewed and endorsed SCE sub-fora longer-term Strategic Plans as required. The SCE undertook assessment of the SMEWG in 2020 and developed plans to assess the remaining 14 SCE sub-fora in 2021.

In addition to SCE's central role in the administration of SCE sub-fora, SCE also oversees and coordinates SCE sub-fora. Some of the notable outcomes this year include:

The Policy Partnership on Women and the Economy (PPWE) supported Malaysia in its hosting of the Women and the Economy Forum in September 2020, which included a High Level Policy Dialogue on Women. The PPWE's key output this year is the La Serena Roadmap for Women and Inclusive Growth Implementation Plan.

The Health Working Group (HWG) and Life Sciences Innovation Forum (LSIF) co-contributed to the 10th APEC High Level Meeting (HLM10) on Health and the Economy with the theme as "Building a Resilient Asia-Pacific in a COVID-19 World".

The Oceans and Fisheries Working Group (OFWG) two key outputs this year were the APEC Roadmap on Marine Debris Implementation Plan and the Implementation Plan for the APEC Roadmap on Combatting Illegal, Unreported, and Unregulated (IUU) Fishing.

The Small and Medium Enterprises Working Group (SMEWG) contributed to the 26th APEC SME Ministerial Meeting (SMEMM) held in October. During SMEMM, the SMEWG Chair presented the main outcomes of the work done last year by SMEWG including the Business Ethics for APEC SMEs Initiative: Vision 2025.

Four APEC economies made financial contributions to the APEC Support Fund's various sub-funds. A discussion of the above and other highlights and priorities are set out in Section 2.

Section 3 gives an overview of all sub-fora governance documents. Each forum also reports on projects, both funded by APEC and self-funded by economies, undertaken in 2020 through Fora in Action tables. The tables include information on which projects and other initiatives of SCE sub-fora

addressed the ECOTECH medium term priorities. Additionally, the Fora in Action tables include the achievements of each SCE sub-fora since the 2019 Report.

Recommendations

The following recommendations are proposed to the 2020 APEC Ministerial Meeting (AMM):

- 1. Note the 2020 Senior Officials' Report on Economic and Technical Cooperation;
- 2. Welcome the La Serena Roadmap for Women and Inclusive Growth Implementation Plan;
- 3. Welcome the achievements of the SCE Working Groups and Policy Partnerships; and
- 4. Welcome 2020 contributions to the APEC Support Funds various sub-funds from Australia; Japan; Korea; and Chinese Taipei.

1. Introduction

In 2020, the SCE was chaired by Mr Mark Talbot, APEC Senior Official for New Zealand. The SCE Vice Chair was Ms Asmidar Abdul Rahman, for Malaysia.

The Committee met on four occasions during 2020 and accomplished the following:

- a. developed a standardized for assessment template and timeline for assessment and delivery to the SCE
- b. assessed the SMEWG and renewed the SMEWG's mandate;
- c. discussed ECOTECH policy initiatives and project proposals;
- d. coordinated the work of SCE sub-fora in response to the COVID-19 pandemic;
- e. facilitated the work of SCE sub-fora by providing direction on Work Plans, Strategic Plans, and Terms of Reference.

The first SCE meeting in 2020 was held on 18 February 2020 in Putrajaya, Malaysia. The SCE established and approved the 2020 SCE Work Plan (2020/SOM1/SCE/002) and the 2020-2023 Terms of Reference (2020/SOM1/SCE/003). The SCE decided to delay the medium-term ECOTECH Review until 2021, to better align medium-term ECOTECH priorities with the forthcoming post-2020 vision. The 2020 Assessment Team was formed of current, and incoming SCE Chair economies (Malaysia, New Zealand and Thailand) and the volunteer economies Australia, Canada, China, Chinese Taipei, and United States. Australia and Canada further volunteered to be the Assessment Team lead economies.

The annual SCE Committee of the Whole (SCE-COW) was held in Putrajaya, on 18 February 2020. It was attended by 20 APEC member economies and 14 SCE sub-fora convenors or their representatives. The SCE approved 10 sub-fora work plans. The SCE noted that only eight of the 15 available work plans contained outcome-related references to women's economic issues and/or mentioned the La Serena Roadmap for Women and Inclusive Growth, despite the instructions on the template to include discussion on these items. The SCE reiterated the importance of including outcome-related reference to women's economic issues. The SCE indicated that it would not approve any 2021 work plan that failed to contain outcome-related references to women's economic issues or reference to reporting requirements for the La Serena Roadmap. SCE-COW was preceded by an informal meeting of fora Chairs and Lead Shepherds, together with group discussions based on the 2020 host year's priorities. These earlier discussions, which sought to explore cross-fora issues and opportunities, witnessed particularly active engagement from participants.

Intersessionally, the SCE endorsed five sub-fora 2020 work plans. The SCE also intersessionally endorsed a 2020 Work Plan Addendum Template to facilitate reporting changes to SCE sub-fora work plans in response to COVID-19 pandemic. The SCE also endorsed Malaysia's self-funded project *Multi-year Policy Dialogue on Innovative Waste Management* (SCE 01 2020S).

The APEC Secretariat hosted SCE 2 in a virtual format on 22 July 2020. SCE 2 included the Policy Dialogue on the Circular Economy in furtherance of the 2020 priority: Driving Innovative Sustainability. The SCE was joined by experts from the Ellen MacArthur Foundation, Unilever,

Malaysia's Ministry of Agriculture and Food Industries, and Tsinghua University. The SCE discussed the cross-cutting nature of circular economy concepts which span APEC.

Intersessionally, the SCE endorsed the OFWG's <u>APEC Marine Debris Roadmap Implementation Plan</u> and the <u>Implementation Plan for the Roadmap on Combatting Illegal, Unreported, and Unregulated (IUU) Fishing</u>. The SCE also endorsed New Zealand's self-funded project <u>Case Studies on Advancing Inclusive Economic Growth: Valuing Indigenous Economies within APEC</u> (SCE 02 2020S).

On 23 September 2020, the APEC Secretariat hosted SCE 3 in a virtual format. The SCE endorsed the <u>Senior Officials' Meeting (SOM) Steering Committee on Economic and Technical Cooperation (SCE)</u> <u>Report on Synergies within the Economic and Technical Cooperation (ECOTECH) Agenda 2020</u> (2020/SCE3/007) and the <u>Report of the APEC Secretariat Executive Director on the Alignment of Fora Work Plans with APEC's Overall Vision and Objectives 2020</u> (2020/SCE3/006). The SCE further discussed the standardized fora assessment program and endorsed the <u>Proposed Senior Officials' Meeting (SOM) Steering Committee on Economic and Technical Cooperation (SCE) Standardized Fora Assessment Template 2020</u> (2020/SCE3/003) and the <u>Timeline of Senior Officials' Meeting (SOM) Steering Committee on Economic and Technical Cooperation (SCE) Sub-Fora Assessments and Reports (2020/SCE3/002). Understanding that the Terms of Reference of the SMEWG at the end of 2020, the SCE agreed to assess the SMEWG immediately and table the completed assessment at SCE 4.</u>

In October, the SCE oversaw Malaysia's successful self-funded project, Multi-Year Policy Dialogue: Innovative Waste Management. As part of the project, Malaysia hosted a virtual policy dialogue on innovative food waste management on 6 October 2020

The fourth SCE meeting (SCE4) was hosted by the APEC Secretariat on 4 November 2020. The SCE renewed the mandate of the SMEWG for a further four years. The SCE also endorsed the *SMEWG's Terms of Reference 2021-2024* (2020/SCE4/005) and *Strategic Plan 2021-2024* (2020/SCE4/004). In addition, the SCE endorsed the PPWE's *La Serena Roadmap for Women and Inclusive Growth Implementation Plan* (2020/SCE4/006).

Intersessionally, the SCE approved the publication of APEC Case Studies on Inclusive Policies. This Korea initiated Policy Support Unit Project examined case studies provided by the Key Contributing Economies of Canada; Chile; China; Korea; Malaysia; New Zealand; Russia; and Chinese Taipei.

2. 2020 Highlights and Priorities

2.1 Host Economy Priorities

During the year, the SCE and its sub-fora furthered 2020 priorities of Inclusive Economic Participation through Digital Economy and Technology as well as Driving Innovative Sustainability.

a. Inclusive Economic Participation through Digital Economy and Technology

Human Resource Development Working Group (HRDWG) discussed how the digital economy can allow inclusive economic participation even during a pandemic through discussions on the Future of Work. In addition, member economies discussed how to plan for future of work needs taking into consideration the impact of COVID-19 pandemic. Member economies were invited to share best practices and to initiate the development of the APEC Action Strategies on Future of Work Post-COVID-19. The discussion took into account the issues and strategies identified in the existing APEC initiatives including the APEC Framework on Human Resources Development in the Digital Age (2017) and APEC Economic Policy Report on Structural Reform and Human Capital Development (2017). Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, there is an urgent need to review these initiatives and to share best practices in the areas of resilient work environment, skill development, social protection and relevant educational program in the digital age.

Following from the endorsement of the La Serena Roadmap for Women and Inclusive Growth by APEC Ministers in 2019, the PPWE developed the La Serena Roadmap Implementation Plan in 2020. The Implementation Plan will provide direction to APEC fora and sub-fora in determining current and new work streams that may contribute to fulfilling the Roadmap's key action areas and meeting its targets. It also establishes a process for monitoring, reporting and reviewing progress that will be overseen by Senior Officials. The PPWE will engage with other APEC fora and sub-fora to support collective efforts toward implementing the Roadmap.

SMEWG held the APEC Young Entrepreneurs Kick-Off with the objective of imparting relevant skills and knowledge to young entrepreneurs to unleash their potential, build up their entrepreneurship skills and knowledge in growing the business; and share ideas and experience between participants and mentors from the pool of successful entrepreneurs.

b. Driving Innovative Sustainability

In an effort to further the innovative sustainability discussion, the SCE held a policy dialogue on circular economy concepts as part of SCE 2. The SCE was joined by experts from the Ellen MacArthur Foundation; Unilever, Singapore; Malaysia's Ministry of Agriculture Research and Development Institute; and Tsinghua University. The conversation centered on the cross-cutting nature of circular economy concepts and resource efficiency. In addition to discussing the reduction in plastic use and waste, the SCE also discussed repurposing agricultural waste by turning it into organic fertilizer for new crops. The SCE also discussed e-waste programs that allow for recycling and repurposing of e-waste such as batteries.

The Agricultural Technical Cooperation Working Group (ATCWG) highlighted the potential of innovative technologies during a policy dialogue addressing food security including digital farming and precision agriculture, vertical farming, traceability using decentralized ledger technology, alternative proteins, waste management, and E-commerce.

Understanding that stable energy supply is essential to achieve sustainable development of all economies and regions the Energy Working Group (EWG) developed the APEC Energy Resiliency

Principle. The principle covers a whole framework and a comprehensive set of factors and initiatives that contribute to improving energy resiliency to disasters. APEC member economies may select and implement the initiatives relevant to each economy's situation. EWG also promoted inclusive and sustainable development in the energy sector by introducing relevant initiatives to enhance energy access towards sustainable economic recovery. The EWG held a policy dialogue at EWG 58 and 59 that centered on the priority of driving innovative sustainability, namely Renewable Energy Transition for Sustainable Growth. EWG members discussed the policy paper "Renewable Energy Transition for Sustainable Growth" provided by the Asia Pacific Sustainable Energy Center with collaboration with Malaysia and Expert Group on New and Renewable Energy Technology and exchanged their views. The paper highlighted that to realise energy transition and shaping green economic growth, it is important to improve business environments and promote business activities, including organising knowledge sharing and relevant capacity development programs, fostering public-private partnerships for dissemination of innovative technologies, and development of relevant products services and renewable projects.

The APEC Experts' Group on Illegal Logging and Associated Trade (EGILAT) conducted work seeking to understand the challenges faced by private sector entities throughout the timber supply chain in trading in legally harvested forest products. In addition, the EGILAT explored measures that have, or could be, adopted to overcome these challenges and identified the existing resources or materials that are available to help private sector entities trade in legally harvested forest products.

Following the endorsement of the APEC Roadmap on Marine Debris by Ministers in 2019, the OFWG developed the *APEC Marine Debris Roadmap Implementation Plan* (2020/SCE3/013). The Marine Debris Implementation Plan was developed to provide more specific action, direction and prioritization for the OFWG and APEC more broadly. The OFWG also developed the *Implementation Plan for the Roadmap on Combatting Illegal, Unregulated, and Unreported (IUU) Fishing* (2020/SCE3/014). The IUU Implementation Plan identifies possible work streams to guide the work of implementation of the Roadmap and advance concerted actions to be achieved by 2025.

The Policy Partnership on Science, Technology, and Innovation (PPSTI) conducted *Promoting Innovation City Development in APEC Region and Cooperation to Contribute to Regional integration 4.0 and Sustainable Growth*, which examined the concept of innovative cities.

2.2 COVID-19 Response

Several SCE sub-fora commenced new work in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. The majority where informal information sharing exercises that allowed APEC members to share information on lessons learned.

The Emergency Preparedness Working Group (EPWG) initiated voluntary information sharing on COVID-19 measures, particularly measures related to emergency preparedness among EPWG economies in April 2020. The initiative encourages sharing and learning about COVID-19 response based on each economy's experience. This information can be found on the APEC website.

The EWG has started to study COVID-19 effects on energy situation, policy and targets in a holistic approach from three aspects (security of supply and demand, safety of infrastructures, welfare of peoples and communities).

The networks of the HRDWG held special COVID-19 related meetings. The Education Network (ED-NET) developed a survey for members that collected information on impact of COVID-19 on education in member economies. The survey covered challenges and obstacles encountered in education when fighting against COVID-19, effective solutions to the challenge, and recommendations for future of education, covering four sections such as preschool, basic education, higher education, and vocational & technical education and training. The ED-NET then met to discuss the education response to COVID-19. The Labour and Social Protection Network (LSPN) also held a special session on COVID-19.

The PPSTI members agreed to endeavor to share their experiences, lessons learned, and best practices under STI areas to support capacity building and innovation, encourage further collaboration in STI, and better inform policy recommendations for improving health systems and resilience planning in the APEC region.

The PPWE held a dedicated session in which economies exchanged views on their respective governments' women-focused responses to the COVID-19 pandemic. Economies compared information on the impacts of the pandemic and economic downturn on women's economic empowerment, and they identified specific policy responses initiated or under development. The PPWE also held a public-private policy dialogue in which business representatives shared information on private sector initiatives to increase women's economic participation in their industries during economic recovery.

The SMEWG started an informal and voluntary information-sharing exercise on measures implemented by APEC economies to foster SMEs resilience during the current COVID-19 crisis.

The Telecommunications and Information Working Group (TELWG) endorsed "APEC TEL Initiative on Global Challenges and Cooperation Utilizing ICT - COVID-19 Pandemic and Beyond". This document outlines possible areas for initiatives that would address current COVID-19 and other prospective global challenges (in the future), especially by utilizing ICT and emerging digital technology. In addition, this document can serve to provide some focus and direction for TELWG's future work and also as the basis to engage in cross-fora collaboration in relation to combatting COVID-19.

2.3 Fora Administration

a. Making Recommendations to SOM on the Terms of Reference of SCE Fora

In accordance with the SCE Terms of Reference, the SCE has the mandate to "review the role and operation of Working Groups and Task Forces with a view to making recommendations to the SOM on establishing, merging, disbanding or reorienting" such working groups and task forces. In 2020, the SCE discussed how to manage the expiration of all SCE sub-fora Terms of Reference in 2020 and 2021. The SCE is currently assessing all sub-fora using a standardized template that will allow the SCE to make recommendations on merging, disbanding, or reorienting sub-fora. Please see Table 1 for an overview of fora administration.

b. Approving Strategic Plans

In 2020, the SCE approved one Strategic Plan: Tourism Working Group 2021-2024.

c. Approving Annual Work Plans

The Terms of Reference of SCE, as reconfirmed in 2020, mandates SCE to "assess and direct realignment of individual work plans of Working Groups and SOM Policy Partnerships with the APEC-wide medium-term ECOTECH priorities and annual objectives as outlined in the ECOTECH framework" and stipulates that "to this purpose, all Working Groups and Policy Partnerships should submit their strategic and annual work plans to the SCE no later than three weeks prior to SOM 1 for consideration at the SCE-Committee of the Whole." Fifteen work plans were submitted and approved by SCE in 2020 (as reflected in Table 1).

At SCE3 in 2020, the Executive Director of the APEC Secretariat presented a report, *Alignment of Fora Work Plans with APEC's Overall Vision and Objectives* (2020/SCE3/003) which noted that most SCE sub-fora focused their activities to respond to the mandates given to them by the Leaders and Ministers. Many sub-fora, such as Anti-Corruption and Transparency Working Group, Counter Terrorism Working Group; Experts Group on Illegal Logging and Associated Trade; Emergency Preparedness Working Group; Energy Working Group; Human Resources Development Working Group; Health Working Group; Oceans and Fisheries Working Group; Policy Partnership on Women and the Economy; Small and Medium Enterprises Working Group; and Tourism Working Group, specifically cite recent instructions of Ministers. A number of these also refer to 2020 APEC priorities. Most notably, all work plans also make linkages between their specific activities and the relevant ECOTECH Medium Term Priorities, which is facilitated by continued use of a template.

2.4 Revised, Standardized Fora Assessment System

In 2006, the SCE was mandated to conduct a review of APEC working groups and task forces and make recommendations to Senior Officials on establishing, merging, disbanding and reorienting these bodies. Ministers endorsed the recommendations of the SCE review and instructed the SCE to continue efforts to improve the operation and work of its fora (2006/CSOM/14). A program of independent assessments was then developed to evaluate all SCE working groups and task forces every four years and support periodic review processes.

In 2016, the SCE Chair proposed, and members accepted, to conduct a review of the Independent Assessment program. Delegations shared the view that fora assessments should be undertaken in the view of providing broader organizational perspectives and facilitating possible rationalization. Delegations also noted the lack of understanding of APEC among certain assessors, uneven follow-up on recommendations and inconsistencies between the review of fora Terms of References and their assessment schedules. Following this, the Secretariat presented a discussion paper to SCE2 (2016/SOM2/SCE/003), which addressed a number of issues, including quality, focus, schedules across different review and monitoring processes, post-assessment measures and attendant financial/administrative burdens.

At SCE3 in 2016, the SCE approved the Decisions on Fora Assessment as proposed by the Chair (2016/SOM3/SCE/011), the main elements of which include developments of a standardized program for assessments, the establishment of an Assessment Team comprising the representatives from the preceding, current, and subsequent SCE Chairing economies, as well as any other volunteering economies with the assistance from the Secretariat; further follow-up by the Assessment Team on the recommendations; and an optional Comprehensive Fora Review following a full cycle of assessments on all the SCE fora.

In 2018, a standardized template for fora assessment was endorsed by SCE (2018/SOM1/SCE/0024). This template was then used to assess four SCE sub-fora in 2018 (as per Table 1). Upon receipt of the four fora assessments, the Assessment Team determined that the information contained in the reports was not sufficient to allow them to make any recommendations to SCE.

At SCE1 in 2019, there was discussion regarding the current standardized for a assessment program. Several economies expressed concern regarding the expense of the current program, the length of the reports produced, and the overall usefulness of the resulting reports. A decision was taken to pause the program while the Assessment Team discussed alternative methods of for assessment.

In 2020 the Assessment Team proposed a new standardized report template. This new standardized report template was endorsed at SCE 3. The first sub-fora assessed using the template was the SMEWG with results tabled at SCE4.

2.5 Cross-Fora Collaboration

Increasing cross-fora collaboration has been under discussion in recent years. A 15th meeting of SCE Fora Chairs and Lead Shepherds (SCE-Committee of the Whole) was held on 18 February 2020 in Putrajaya, Malaysia. Chairs and Lead Shepherds or their representatives from 14 of the 15 SCE fora participated. The presence of Chairs, Lead Shepherds or their representatives increased their interactions with each other and Senior Officials, leading to useful practical suggestions for collaborating with other APEC fora. Also at SCE 3 2020, the APEC Secretariat introduced its report, "SCE Report on Synergies within the ECOTECH Agenda" (2020/SCE/007). To further underscore the importance of cross-fora collaboration, fora are required to report on their cross-fora collaborations in annual fora reports. In addition, the standardized fora assessment program also measures data and indicators relating to cross-fora collaboration. In 2020, SCE and its sub-fora have 100+ projects in implementation. Of those projects, over 30% of them include some manner of cross-fora collaboration. In addition, many sub-fora hold joint meetings with other SCE sub-fora as well as with EC and CTI and its sub-fora.

2.6 APEC Support Fund

In 2004, Ministers endorsed the Australian proposal to set up the APEC Support Fund (ASF) to serve as a flexible funding mechanism. The ASF aims to meet the capacity building needs for developing economy members in APEC's agreed high priority sectors for economic and technical cooperation. Since its inception, the fund has received contributions from many economies.

Voluntary contributions by APEC members to the ASF and its sub-funds in 2020 (as of 4 November 2020) were made or committed by four economies: Australia; Japan; Korea; and Chinese Taipei.

Australia provided USD 398,524 to the ASF General Fund, after redirection of the uncommitted balance of the ASF Mining Sub-Fund after cessation of the ASF Mining Sub-Fund (subject to SOMs approval) and USD 204,750 to the ASF Marine Debris Management and Innovation Sub-fund.

Japan provided USD 1,057,283 to the ASF Energy Efficiency and Low Carbon Measures Sub-fund.

Korea provided a contribution of USD 700,000 to the ASF Digital Innovation Sub-fund.

Chinese Taipei provided a contribution of USD 1,450,000 split amongst the ASF Digital Innovation Sub-fund, the ASF Human Security Sub-fund, and the ASF Marine Debris Management and Innovation Sub-fund.
